Athletics Hold Five Tilt Advantage Over Second Place Browns

GIANTS DROP TO THIRD

Yanks Beat Indians Five to One

**NEW YORK, June 8 (UPI)—**The St. Louis Cardinals are guaranteed in a ten-game series against the National League pennant race that promises to become as large as the march of leadership in the Philadelphia American circuit.

The Cardinals, who waited until the last few days of the season before they clinched the 1930 championship, today enjoyed a four-game, but not trouble-free, victory over the Chicago Cubs. In the American league the Athletics held a five-contest advantage over the Washington Senators.

The Cardinals split a doubleheader with Brooklyn yesterday, losing to the Dodgers, 4 to 4, and winning the second 9 to 7.

Chicago gained sole possession of first place in the National League from the Giants, 3 to 2. New York was tied with the Cubs previous to the contest.

Boston and Cincinnati split a twin bill, the Reds winning the opener, 8 to 2, and dropping the second game, 4 to 3.

Philadelphia retained its mark of leadership in the American league, the Tigers, 12 hits off of Mafayeff but could do nothing in the pluses and 18 men left on base.

Washington moved two straight over Chicago, 8 to 1.

Lefty Gomez pitched the New York Yankees to a 10 to 4 decision over the Cleveland Indians.

The Boston Red Sox were their second in a row from St. Louis, 6 to 4.
