Cain, southern group, termed the present situation of the railroads an emergency threatening serious financial ruin and their capacity to assure the public a continuance of efficient and adequate service.

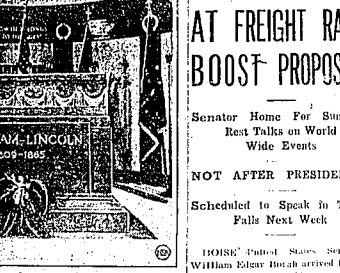

FORMER IDAHO TIMES OWNER BURIED AT VINTON, IA., SUNDAY AFTERNOON

Funeral services for Henry G. Kruse, 61, a former publisher of the Evening Times, owner of the Cedar Valley Times at Vinton, Ia., and father of Mrs. Paul Bowditch, final, were conducted at Vinton, Sunday, following the tragic death of the well-known newspaperman near Albert, La., Monday afternoon.

The services were held in the Methodist church at 2:30 o'clock and were largely attended. Cate Sells, national Keene Train salesman, came to Vinton for the ceremonies.

The account of the accident as given by his associates, states that he was en route to St. Paul on business, accompanied by his daughter-in-law, Mrs. Marion Kruse and Frank Kruse and the latter's three children, when a wheel collapsed and the car turned over twice.

Kruse was only slightly injured, as were the children.

This was at about 3:30 o'clock in the afternoon. Mrs. Kruse sustained a broken vertebra in the neck and the spinal cord was partly severed, resulting in paralysis from the waist down. She remained in a semi-conscious state and was able to talk with members of her family who arrived a few hours before his death at midnight at the Sacred Hospital in Albert, La.

Members of the family, who left Vinton in two cars, following receipt of the news of the accident, comprised Mrs. H. G. Kruse, Marion and Frank Kruse and the daughter, Mrs. Emil Bowditch and husband. Another son, Herbert, and the car turned over twice.

Presidential Reception Notably Cold in Ohio

BY RAYMOND CLAPPEN ADJUNCT PRESIDENTIAL TRAIN, JUNE 17 (UP)—President Hoover's first Presidential train, joining toward the presidential election has met with a mixed reception, in the opinion of those traveling in his party today.

While the 6:00 a.m. at the Republican chicken dinner in Indianapolis Monday night was more enthusiastic than any audience he has addressed so far, the reception there was again, as he drove through the city preparatory to leaving for Marion, Mo., Tuesday, the most sparsely and lack of demonstration experienced on his arrival yesterday.

Few persons were out to see Mr. Hoover depart, although his schedule was widely published. Persons on the curbs lifted their hats respectfully, but, occasionally there was a cheer or friendly shout. The reaction of the street crowds in Canton, Ohio, Tuesday, the arrival yesterday, was no indication of considerable discussion on the presidential train.

Defenders of the president held it was no indication of lack of support any more than the terrific demonstration received in 1923 by Grover Cleveland. Hoover's Indiana Republican victory was greeted with enthusiasm. Indiana Republicans were being quoted privately as holding serious fears for the state in the coming election.

Preparations are being made for a reception in Marion, Ohio, Monday night, which may include a reception by the Governor James E. Watson, Republican senate leader, such as he never experienced.

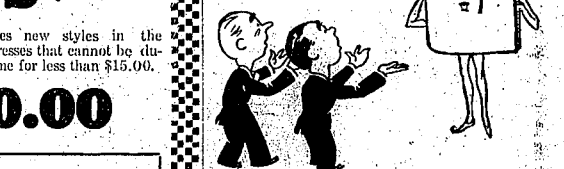
