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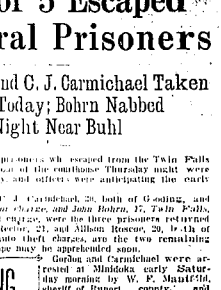

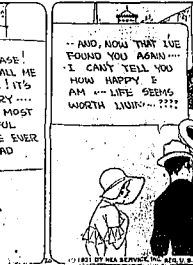

Situated in a beautiful and secluded spot directly northwest of the Twin city park, it is fully equipped to care for 35 children. All children entering the camp have been immunized against smallpox, diphtheria, and all other infectious diseases removed where necessary, and dental corrections have been made.

No sick children are admitted. It is not a sanitarium but a recreation camp for the children who are underweight and with acute fever, measles and other children's diseases. Seven children who are ready to attend the camp are from Twin Falls; five from Drift; two from Flater; two from Cassiopolis; two from Hannay; one from Deep Creek; one from Hannay; one from Hellsburg, and one from Northstar, Idaho.

Special Care

Through a six months' course of correct diet and rest which is hoped to be accomplished, follow-up work will then be done in the homes through the health unit. The age limit is 8 to 12 years. A nutrition specialist, a physical director and a camp nurse, will make up the administrative force of the camp.

With the Anti-Tuberculous Christmas Seal money sold in Twin Falls county the camp buildings have been erected. This year contributions by the citizens of the county must be depended upon to care for the children to pay \$150,000 in the amount needed.

Every citizen is invited and urged to visit the camp Sunday and assist in the work with its purpose and possibilities.
