

# World Welcomes Hoover War Debt Plans

## NO PARLEY SCHEDULED, SPEEDY ACTION ASKED FOR IMMEDIATE RELIEF

**DEBTOR NATIONS TO HAVE ONE YEAR WITHOUT PAYMENT**

Berlin Sees Wildest Stock Boom In Years

BERLIN, June 22 (UP)—The wildest boom in years broke out in the Berlin Bourse today under the impact of Hoover's debt proposals.

The entire list shot up, such important stocks as I. G. Farben rising 15 points, industrial, chemicals and other shares were beneficiaries of the boom.

Foreign and domestic buyers including French dealers for the first time in months flooded the market, with orders and trading so active that the posting of prices and fulfillment of orders was retarded.

The most important immediate and practical benefit of the Hoover proposal developed today when it was reported that the run on Reichbank's foreign gold reserves, which totalled more than \$1,000,000,000 marks on Saturday, had ceased.

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**STIMSON SAYS NEXT MOVE IS UP TO COUNTRIES**

WASHINGTON, June 22 (UP)—Pragmatic action on the part of foreign nations will be necessary, Secretary of State Stimson said today to make effective President Hoover's proposal for a one year suspension of international payments causing the project in a press conference. Stimson said an international conference would be called to debate Mr. Hoover's suggestion.

The secretary said that the United States was relying on individual action by the various nations concerned to get the program into operation. Stimson believes a heavy immediate remedy will insure consummation of the suspension plan but that an international conference would cause a project to lose effective force upon economic conditions.

## Harbour Outlines Highway Plans For Local Section

State road work projected in Twin Falls highway district, was announced here Saturday by Alvin Harbour, commissioner of public works and includes the following:  
Addition avenue to be taken over from the city limits to Hansen bridge, the road to be resurfaced and milled; the Twin Falls highway district to reconstruct a stretch of about three-fourths of a mile in length from the bridge on a new grade southwest from the southern approach of the bridge to Junction with U. S. Highway No. 20. The state highway department to take over from the filtering plant west to Goshwin on U. S. Highway No. 20, and south on that highway to the Nevada state line.  
To Ogilby, Highway 23 between the state line and Rossport, this project to cost approximately \$20,000.

That part of U. S. No. 33 between Rossport and Goshwin, in the opinion of state highway engineers, should be straightened, widened and shored up by being permanently improved, and for that reason cannot be included in the present program.

In addition to the foregoing definite projects Harbour proposed to the board of directors of the Twin Falls highway district that if federal aid could not be secured on the improvement of the highway from the Booth corner to the Twin Falls bridge, the highway from the Booth corner to the Twin Falls bridge on a 100-foot basis.

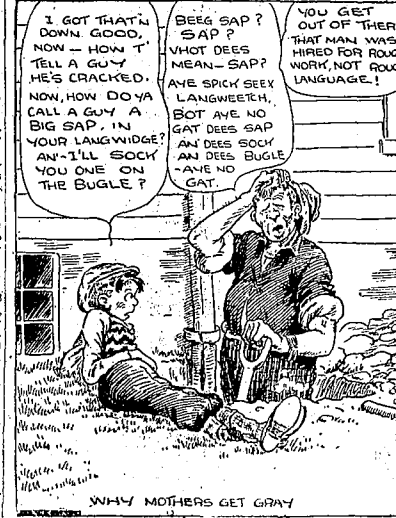

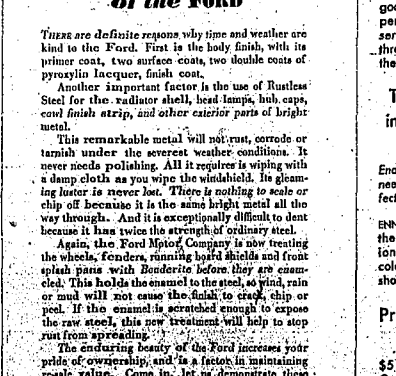

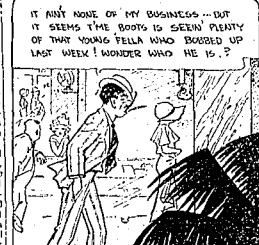
