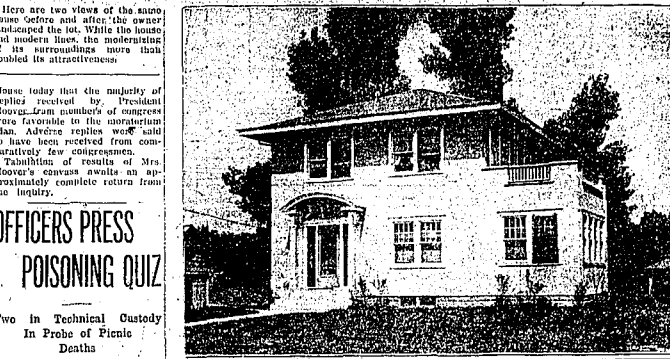

GILBERTVILLE, Ind., June 23 (AP)—Officers were questioned and a "mystery man" hunted today as preparations were made to bury a man who died after eating poisoned sandwiches at a family reunion picnic.

The hunt for the "mystery man" began when Sam Dappen, a drug clerk told police that two weeks ago he sold a gram of strychnine to a farmer who said he wanted to "kill some cows." Dappen could not identify the girl father, John Simmons, the lawyer of the picnic.

Paneled Walls Rich In Decorative Appeal

Just at the present time there is a revival in the use of paneled walls when finishing the interior of the home.

Paneled walls have long been held to be suitable only for the vestibule of the home. The price of panels was the determining factor in their use. Since the cost of paneling was high, their use was evidence of wealth.

Today improved methods have lowered costs. The newer kinds of panels and different ways of applying over plaster or canvas, wall paper and other materials, have made paneled walls within the reach of all.

Whereas the walls of the residence of years ago were either plain painted and stained wood, they will now have a plaster board finish by used. The French paneling with by one or more-tones may be applied over plaster or canvas, wall paper also may be applied in various plain colors between, and the paneling. DISARMAMENT TO BE CONSIDERED BY INTERNATIONAL B. P. W. GROUP
NEW YORK, June 23.—The cause and care of world-wide unemployment and the creation of a public opinion favorable to disarmament will be the twin themes of discussion at the First International Congress of Business and Professional Women, scheduled for July 25-29 in Miami, Florida, according to an announcement made Tuesday by Miss Lena Madala, Phillips of New York City, international president.

"There is close relationship between these topics," Mrs. Phillips said. "Since most differences between nations result from economic causes, a study of the economic situation which has created the present world-wide unemployment is a natural preliminary to the discussion of disarmament. Our experience in forming the International Federation has taught us that the majority of women are in favor of the abolition of war."

Success of the 1932 disarmament conference depends to large measure, we believe, upon the creation of an enlightened public opinion.

EXPERT PREDICTS PROPERTY WEALTH IN BOULDER AREA

Engineer Says Dam Will Be Means Of Raising Value 10-Fold
SURVEYED OWEN JOB
Fortrays Fine Picture Of District's Future

PASADENA, June 24 (UP)—Predictions that property wealth in the area to be served by the Boulder dam water and power will increase more than 10-fold were made by E. R. Scattergood, electrical engineer of the Los Angeles municipal department of water and power, before the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

Ten years after the completion of the structure, Scattergood declared, property values will jump \$120,000,000 and industrial productions will jump \$4,000,000,000. He said he based his estimate on the growth that followed the development of the Owens valley power and water project and an economic survey made for the project.

The first power of the Owens river project was available in 1917. In the future time that followed the total wealth of the Los Angeles metropolitan area tripled. Industrial activity in the area increased from \$17,000,000 in 1916 to \$1,250,000,000 in 1928. These figures indicate what Boulder dam will do for the district.

"Because of the great trade possibilities of the countries bordering the Pacific, the undeveloped fertile agricultural areas and mineral deposits and of foreign trade opportunities for manufacturing which are conditional only on an assured permanency of water and power, it may be expected that the total wealth of property values will be more than double."
