NEW YORK, Jan. 1 (UP)—Authorities here today believed they were tightening the net on a plot to blow up the New York Stock Exchange and other financial centers across the country by distributing in packages of powerful bombs from New York and Boston. Three lives have been claimed by the bombs and there is a possibility that many more will be lost in the months or years. The authorities here, working in close cooperation with the FBI, have identified a group of men who are believed to be the perpetrators of the plot.

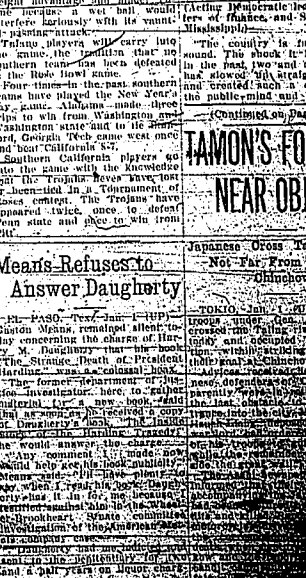
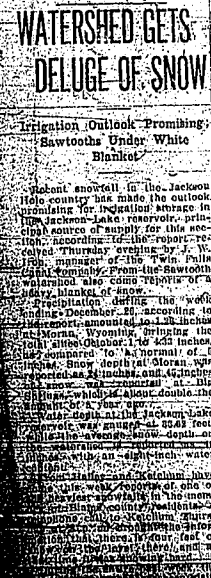

POWER COMPANY IN 1931 PROFITS MUCH NEW LINE

Division Manager Says Continuation of Extension Program is Planned

We are now confronted with the prospect of another winter that was not in 1932. What we did in 1931 is now a matter of history, valuable chiefly in the lessons learned from the experience gained the year ago. Twin Falls county was one of the few bright spots on the business map of the United States. The experiences of the past year have proved that we can meet the conditions of a winter that is not in 1932.

During the past year the Idaho Power Company's earnings were \$3,500,000. The electric lines in Twin Falls county, this department's 1931 earnings were \$1,200,000. Our program of 1932 and 1933, but it compares very favorably with the extension program of 1932 and 1933. At the present time the cost of construction is being kept down by any other period during the company's existence and for this reason we expect to continue an active extension program during 1932, so that there is no territory not having electric service at this time can take advantage of this cost reduction.

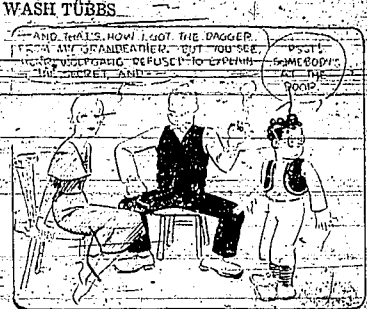

DAIRY INDUSTRY CONDITIONS GOOD
O. T. Koster, Creamery Manager, Looks To Future With Optimism
BY D. T. KISTNER

Conditions in the dairy industry at the close of the year 1931 compared to a year previous are considerably better, therefore I look forward to the coming year with confidence.
Holdings of dairy products, which always accumulate during the heavier producing months of the year, are being marketed at a price which is a fair return on the cost of production, were they not, they would be a waste of money. This year, especially butter which showed a marked increase in price, was sold at \$8.00 and \$8.012, 100 pounds respectively. Consumption of all dairy products "especially" butter has also been much heavier this year due in part to educational campaigns conducted by the local sales of such products.
Butter prices have generally lower this year than in previous years. However, they are formed by several dairymen in this section, that with previous feed prices, where a minimum of commercial dairy feeds are purchased, butter can be produced at a profit, with a herd of good producing cows.
The past year has shown a slight increase in butter production for the whole country, therefore it behoves all farmers making cows to cut their own production and raise the average production of their herd as high as possible.
I have the utmost confidence in Soehner's ability and believe that butterfat can be produced as cheaply here as in any section of the country, and I firmly believe that this section will produce more pounds of butter per acre than any other section of the United States.
The output of our Co-operative creamery handling the products of some 100 dairymen in this community this year will amount to a total of over 20 million pounds of butter. This has been a cash income to the dairy farmers being marketed through the Challenge Cream & Butter Assn. The farmers own marketing organization of more than 20,000 dairymen on the Pacific coast, the farmers receiving consumers.

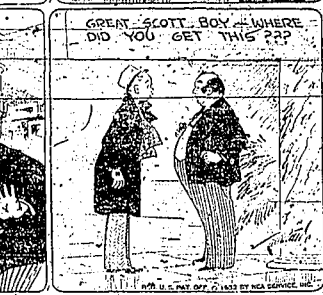
