Turkeys are shipped through the Idaho Egg, Produce and Poultry Association, representative of the Northwest Turkey Growers' association.

Figures received from the Idaho Egg Producers' association this week indicate that there were 1076 birds shipped in the Nov. 23-24 shipment. The total was 210 chicks and 46 chickens. The total weight was 13,259 pounds. The total amount received was \$17,103.88. Prices ranged from 25¢ from prime birds to 24¢ for common birds. The average price paid after deducting expenses amounted to 27.6¢ cents per pound. The price paid in New York was 28¢ cents per pound.

Figures for the December 4 shipment show that there were 1921 prime birds in this shipment 541 chicks and 63 chickens. The total weight was 12,583 pounds. An average of 132 pounds per turkey. Prices have not yet been received for the December shipment.

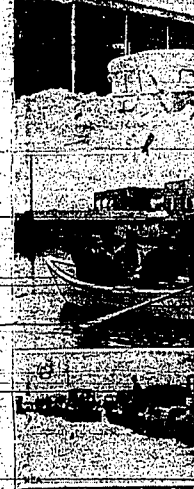

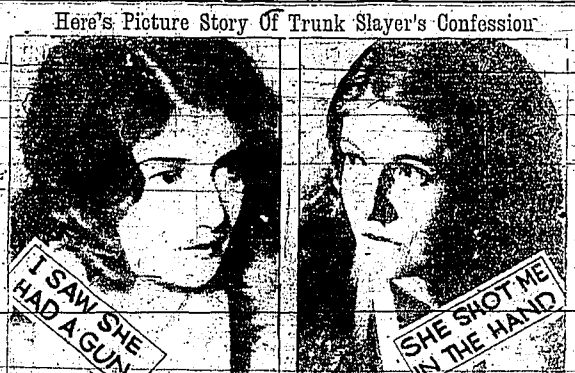

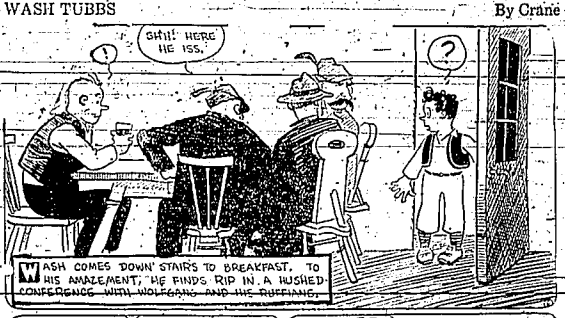

DOLE OR STARVATION
 THE Senate sub-committee which is considering unemployment relief seems to have drawn some plain and forceful talk from the various charity workers who have testified before it in the last few days. The crisis that these men have described seems to be acute. One after another they have asserted that private contributions cannot possibly meet the needs of organized relief work this winter. Public funds must be used; the relief workers do not care greatly whether such funds come from city, state or national treasuries, so long as they do come.
 This puts a new light on things. That little word, "dole," is no doubt a fairly horrid word. It is not, however, quite so horrid as that other word, "starvation." The taxpayer must carry the load, to a certain extent. The only question is, which pocket does he wish to dip into to meet the situation?

WHITE HOUSE VISITORS
 THE "Mayor of Shantytown," who headed the army of 10,000 unemployed assembled in Washington Thursday to demand relief, predicted revolution unless there is "devolution" in the American system of government.
 According to an article written by Father James R. Cox, and copyrighted by United Press, here is what he said:

We are not red demonstrators. We are real, honest American citizens and the people I represent here, as well as millions of others throughout the country, are entitled to work. In a country bursting with wealth there is no reason why employment and other relief should not be provided.

The 10,000 jobless men who are gathered in Washington to petition Congress and the President for relief demand immediate action. If Congress refuses us, we are open to anything and everything—in other words bloodshed.
 This country is soething with revolt. The so-called representatives of the people are not helping the country. They are bound to their masters. We are going to have a change unless our people are the most supine the world has ever seen.

The change will come violently and smoothly. If we don't get on the job pretty soon and start cleaning house, according to the dictates of law and reason, soon we won't have the chance. All civilizations have followed the same course, either evolution or revolution.

We urge that money be appropriated to be used in direct relief of distressed families; that inheritance and other taxes on the wealthy be imposed; that large public work construction be undertaken. These are some of the things necessary to raise revenue and bring about relief.

Rather violent language, mildly uttered. Speaker Garner and President Hoover were wise in giving the men a hearing and in treating them with courtesy. Sooner or later their demands must be heard and answered, for large numbers of persons can go without work just so long and no longer. It is a deplorable condition, yes. But one that cannot be ignored indefinitely.

STIMSON'S STATEMENT
 IMPORTANT in the extreme is the situation as it exists in Manchuria. All the steps taken in the developments will be fully covered by the Evening Times for its readers, who will hope for an early settlement of the problems.
 The full text of Secretary Stimson's notes to Japan and China reads:

"With the recent military operations about China, the last remaining administrative authority of the government of the Chinese Republic in South Manchuria as it existed prior to September 18th, 1931, has been destroyed."

"The American government continues confident that the work of the neutral commission recently authorized by the Council of the League of Nations will facilitate an ultimate solution of the difficulties now existing between China and Japan. But in view of the present situation and of its own rights and obligations therein, the American government deems it to be its duty to notify both the Imperial Japanese government and the government of the Chinese Republic that it cannot admit the legality of any situation of fact nor does it intend to recognize any treaty or agreement entered into between those governments, or agents thereof, which would impair the treaty rights of the United States or its citizens in China, including those which relate to the sovereignty, the independence, or the territorial and administrative integrity of the Republic of China, or to the international policy relative to China, commonly known as the Open Door policy; and that it does not intend to recognize any situation, treaty or agreement which may be brought about by means contrary to the covenants and obligations of the Pact of Paris of August 27, 1928, and which treat both China and Japan, as well as the United States, as parties."

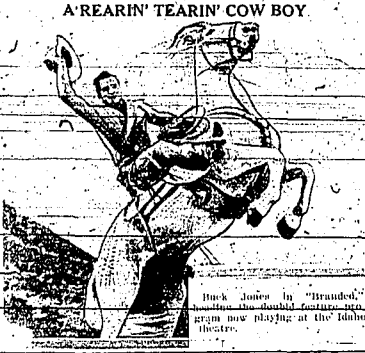
