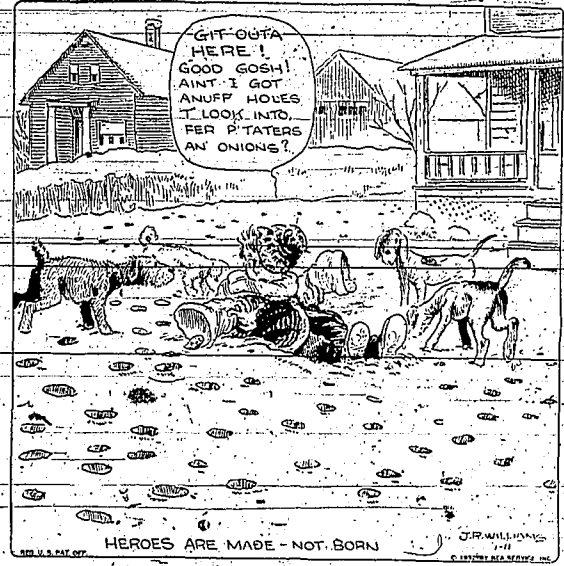

A WONDERFUL RECORD A LITTLE item in the Evening Times last week told a big story. It related the record that Twin Falls made in the years 1930 and 1931, regarding auto accident fatalities.

Just where the credit should go, is unimportant in comparison with the fact that the record was established and the city has a clean record for two whole years. Of course there were many auto fatalities in the county during the period mentioned, which tends to detract from the record made, but it will be to the everlasting credit of the citizens of Twin Falls, the city's motorists, its officers, its traffic regulations, its Department of Public Safety headed by Commissioner J. E. White, its School Boy Patrols, and the community in general that this record has been made.

Now to make a similar record for 1932 may well be the objective of the city and its environs. It has been proved that the accomplishment is not impossible. In 1929, there were four such fatalities in the city limits. A campaign was launched to overcome this appalling toll. It apparently has succeeded remarkably. If the record can be maintained and be extended to include the highways in the county, it will be something for which everyone may be proud of a year hence.

IDAHO FALLS POWER PROBLEM

COMPLAINING of excessive costs of commercial lighting rates, merchants of Idaho Falls have voted to darken display signs and window lighting at six o'clock during the week and at eight o'clock Saturdays. Sunday evenings they will remain dark also. The action appears to be more than an economy measure. It is a retaliatory action against the city, which operates a municipal lighting plant, charging, according to the merchants, unduly high rates.

NEW COUNTRY DOCTORS

ALTHOUGH the old-time country doctor is rapidly disappearing, it is becoming apparent that his place is to be taken by a physician who will render equally valuable service. This is the conclusion reached by the Committee on the Costs of Medical Care, headed by Dr. Ray Lyman Wilbur, which recently made a survey of health conditions in a typical rural community.

BRYAN'S GHOST STALKS

THE ghost of William Jennings Bryan must have stalked restlessly through whatever part of the Elysian Fields are reserved for master politicians when Senator Wheeler arose the other day to propose the coinage of silver on a 16 to 1 ratio. The fiery campaign of 1896, when conservative businessmen quaked in their shoes at the thought of the "boy orator" from the Platte county; Mark Hanna and the first of the great campaign funds; Bryan's amazing "swing around the circle" with cheering crowds and torchlight processions under the "patrie moon"; William McKinley introducing the nation to the "front porch" campaign; a nation's discontent massing itself behind a man with a golden voice and a proposed papacane was there, ever a campaign like it.

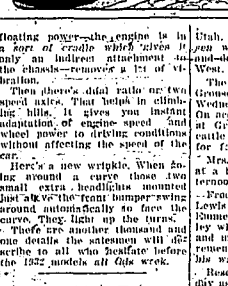
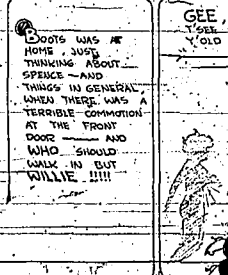

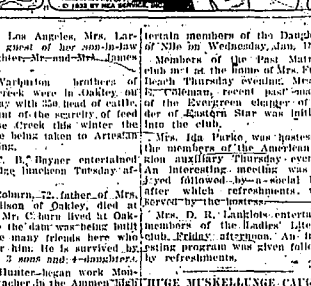
