Difference in Senate and House Legislation Delays Final Action

WASHINGTON, Jan. 16 (UP)—By passage of the reconstruction corporation bill Congress has amplified its "easy money" policy as a stroke for President Hoover's financial policy. The measure, which has passed the House by a vote of 355 to 55, is a credit of several billions.

Many billions more of proposed credit will be authorized in the measure. The bill is the first of a series of measures of the President's program, together with a number of other bills, which are introduced by the Federal Reserve board in its "easy money" policy for credit to be made available to various channels.

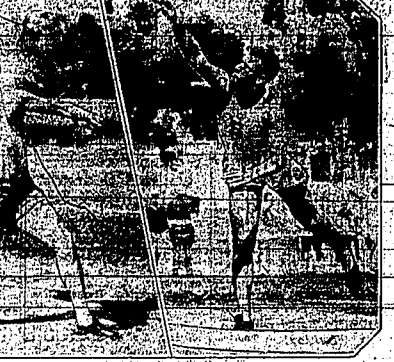
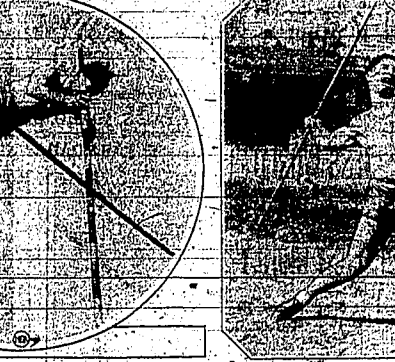

HUNT PRESENTS WEEED BUREAU'S ACHIEVEMENTS

Lower Costs of Material And Labor Provided During Past Year.

Report of activities of the Twin Falls county weed bureau during the past year, including a statement of savings, was given by E. E. Hunt, head of the bureau.

A saving of \$115 per hundred acres in the cost of weed eradication was achieved through the use of Attidac, another important material in the work of the department, which cost about 25 cents per pound in 1931. Total saving on cost of applying and purchasing materials and of carrying them to new equipment, is estimated at \$125.68.

The statement by Hunt pointed out that a discontinuance of the work of the bureau would void the beneficial effect of work already done, and declares the county would eventually be forced to resume the work at a greater cost.

Hunt's statement in full follows: "In closing up the work of the weed bureau for the year just ending, we find that considerable savings have been made through the use of material and labor. Savings have been brought about by education in weeding, buying better and improved methods of application. We feel, however, that there is yet room for more improvement as in the national savings can be made in the future.

Carbon Sulphide Favored.

"Prior to 1931 the use of par-k had been done. Just what the results from the 1931 season's work will be I do not know. It is estimated that the use of carbon disulfide will be especially on small areas. The past season our crews treated about 600 different patches of weeds in one day.

"The use of par-k is a satisfactory material with satisfactory results.

"It is especially so to have come to this office from the use of carbon sulphide, and when they do not use this material, it is more expensive. The farmer has failed to follow instructions, to some of the cost of carbon sulphide has been avoided but we do not think it cheaper in the long run. We have many complaints of weeds being carried from one place to another on the other hand many very satisfactory results may be seen."

Salt Too Costly.

"The chlorates are, we think, the only practical spray for weed eradication here. Salt, while not a spray, is out of the question on account of salt will do to every thing salt will do it is cheaper. The statement by Hunt pointed out that a discontinuance of the work of the bureau would void the beneficial effect of work already done, and declares the county would eventually be forced to resume the work at a greater cost.

Hunt's statement in full follows: "In closing up the work of the weed bureau for the year just ending, we find that considerable savings have been made through the use of material and labor. Savings have been brought about by education in weeding, buying better and improved methods of application. We feel, however, that there is yet room for more improvement as in the national savings can be made in the future.

Carbon Sulphide Favored.

"Prior to 1931 the use of par-k had been done. Just what the results from the 1931 season's work will be I do not know. It is estimated that the use of carbon disulfide will be especially on small areas. The past season our crews treated about 600 different patches of weeds in one day.

"The use of par-k is a satisfactory material with satisfactory results.

"It is especially so to have come to this office from the use of carbon sulphide, and when they do not use this material, it is more expensive. The farmer has failed to follow instructions, to some of the cost of carbon sulphide has been avoided but we do not think it cheaper in the long run. We have many complaints of weeds being carried from one place to another on the other hand many very satisfactory results may be seen."

Salt Too Costly.
