QUESTION OF LENIENCY

WHAT should be done to a prisoner who saves the life of the officer who arrested him?

This unusual question has arisen in the province of Quebec, where five lumbermen were arrested by two detectives for trying to hang a boss they didn't like. The detectives marched their prisoners off to jail, and led them across a frozen river. Halfway over the river the ice broke and the two detectives went into the water.

Instead of leaving them there, the prisoners pulled them out—and then meekly accompanied them the rest of the way to jail.

Whether or not this will induce the court to be lenient with them is not yet apparent. The ordinary man will probably think that it ought to, at any rate.

THE HAWAIIAN PROBLEM

IT IS becoming evident that the unfortunate situation in Hawaii is by no means as clear-cut an affair as the early dispatches indicated.

Beyond question, Admiral Pratt is at least partly right in assailing the actions of many of the tourists who visit Honolulu. In addition, it is well to remember that the city contains many races, living close together and often entertaining widely divergent standards and desires.

Besides that, there is the sad but undeniable fact that shore folk and sailors do not always get along well together. American seaports which the fleet visits regularly have frequently had mix-ups in which blue-jacket and townsmen have disagreed bitterly.

Add all these things together, and one can see that the Hawaiian difficulty is a complex affair, the outcome of many different factors. By bearing that fact in mind we may avoid giving the people of Hawaii a greater share of the blame than they actually deserve.

SPENDING STATE MONEY

EVERYBODY understands, by this time, the urgent necessity of wiping out the deficit in the federal treasury.

Unfortunately, the publicity this deficit has received has made governmental economy seem to be almost exclusively a federal affair. The part that it should play in state governments has been overlooked.

It is odd that this should be so; for over-spending at the state capital will hit the average citizen much more quickly and painfully than will over-spending at Washington.

A business man, for instance, may pay Uncle Sam \$20 a year in income taxes, and he will kick like a steer if this rises to \$30. But his state will collect an equal sum from him annually in gasoline taxes alone, and he will hardly know, offhand, whether the gasoline tax has gone up or down lately.

Similarly, if he owns his home, his state, city and county government will collect from \$200 to \$500 a year from him. Carefree spending at the state capital can add \$10 or \$20 a year to that sum very easily. Yet he will pay little or no attention to what his legislature does, while he will groan pitifully if Congress boosts his income tax.

All of this emphasizes the value of a survey made recently by the Alexander Hamilton Institute showing how state indebtedness has increased in the last few years.

In 1918, for instance, the total indebtedness of all the state governments was approximately half a billion dollars. At the end of 1930 it was just under two and a half billion. In 1918 the states' debts amounted to \$5.41 per capita; today they stand at \$20.04.

Governmental economy, in other words, is something that state, as well as national, legislators need to think about. These figures show that ordinarily they fail to do so. If retirement is imperatively needed at Washington, the same is no less true at the ordinary state capital.

Now that Harold L. Yeomans, Buhi attorney, has made bold to announce his candidacy for congress, it may be expected that from now on out hats will be cast into the political ring with increasing numbers. Friends of W. Orr Chapman are awaiting his announcement or candidacy for the United States senatorship. Frank Keenan, former Twin Falls county man is being frequently mentioned for the secretary of state post and there are other candidates in the making in both political parties.

Senator Hiram Johnson of California is silent on becoming a Republican presidential candidate. Being from California he probably knows there are some things like snowstorms—there's no use talking about.


Now that the nation's two big national parties are baffled, there's talk of a third. And no one knows what will come forth.
