## Truce Relieves Tension In Crisis at Shanghai

## STATES USE AXE ON GOVERNMENT COSTS THIS YEAR

General Business Conditions Cause Drastic Expenses Curtailment

## MISSOURI SITUATION DECLARED CRITICAL

Wyoming Taxpayers Demand Reductions at Various Meetings

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (UPI)—The hand of economy's necessity has tightened purse strings of government agencies in states of the West Coast and the Rocky mountain region.

The decline in commodity prices that reached its lowest point on two major products of the country, wheat and cotton, in 1931 caused taxpayers to scrutinize their lives with a more critical eye than ever before.

## Residents Ordered

Reductions have been ordered in expenditures of state departments and institutions, with salary cuts and some increases in payrolls. Some state organizations are prepared to go before the legislatures next winter with a program for eliminating waste, consolidating units of government, and strict curtailment of expenses.

"Missouri is faced with a critical situation," said Gov. Harry S. Caulfield recently.

"Unless we cut down expenses now, we will not have the money to meet the obligation with certainty no money to put the state in,"

The situation in the various states:

Missouri—Cost of operating the state in 1931 was \$17,100,695, with an additional \$13,392,683 spent on road maintenance. Total cost of state was \$35,000,000 to the deficit of the state treasury, which it is estimated will reach \$10,000,000 by the end of the year.

Kansas—Reaching about one-half the amount of the state's budget, the tax burden to reach persons now escaping their share in the cost of government services.

Wyoming offices are the principal means of relief, supervised by Governor Harry Woodring.

Oklahoma—Parliament and state oil department officials all "down-graded" their programs to save \$1,000,000. It is estimated that per cent reduction in costs.

Texas—Appropriations for the biennial period ending in September, 1932, total \$10,000,000, reduced by voters who spent \$4,000,000 from appropriations. The sum of \$3,000,000 does not include the cost of building other special items.

## GETTING CANDIDATES TO THINK.

The Kentucky House of Representatives, in inviting all of the active and passive contenders for the Democratic presidential nomination to come down and address a joint session of the Kentucky legislature, seems to have got on the trail of an excellent idea.

There used to be a theory, in American politics, that a candidate for the presidency owed it to his fellow countrymen to make numerous public speeches so that his attitude on every major issue before the electorate could be unmistakably clear. That theory, of course, has gone woefully out of fashion lately, and the idea now seems to be to say nothing whatever until you can't possibly remain silent any longer.

Kentucky's idea would restore the old custom; and really, it is a custom very much worth restoring.

## A CERTAIN FUTURE

THIS section is inhabited by a pretty patient lot of folks.

After going through a trying year that would tax the patience of Job, on every hand one sees examples of fortitude and of a philosophical attitude of mind which are splendid object lessons to the country as a whole and fine evidences of the inherent quality of our citizenship.

When this community faced what at the time appeared to be a crisis, the appeal was made in these columns for the continued display of just the kind of attitude which has and is being evinced; an appeal to face facts squarely and to meet problems nobly and manfully as is our wont.

Farmers generally, confronted with rock-bottom prices which they can blame on to anything they wish, including "world-wide depression" (when in fact they must know that the main cause is the infamous Smoot-Hawley tariff enacted by the present administration against the advice of over a hundred economists who predicted the results) have taken their medicine with but much audible complaint.

The fine attitude of mind of the people was well demonstrated when more than a thousand depositors met early in the winter at Legion Memorial hall, and named a committee of competent men to look after their future interests. The business of the meeting was carried through with dispatch, and though important to do so, hardly a man could be induced to talk, to vent his spleen, so to speak. Those who said anything had only praise for the spirit of the people and confidence in the fundamental resources of the community.

Again, as had been previously mentioned here, at the annual canal company meeting early this month, some five hundred landowners in their deliberations hewed straight to the line, turned down an opportunity to relieve themselves of the necessity of meeting their maintenance obligations promptly, reelected their officers, and called it a day.

Last week a similar number of bean growers, in annual meeting of their association, reelected their officials, refused to become agitated over the demoralized situation in the market and put their faith in the future.

Three-score men from all parts of the county gathered here one night this week to take up the problems of taxation, but not to talk about it. There were no tirades, no oratory, no arguments. Like the other gatherings, strong confidence was evidenced in the constituted authorities. No-one in particular has a solution for any of the ills, excepting that all agree on the end to be attained, that of reduced expenditures in accordance with the ability of the assessed to pay.

Perhaps the reason for the apparent apathy in the cases cited, is because the people have been sobered by their experiences. Certainly it is not because they are not volatile. One prefers to think it is because this community is made up of an intelligent type of reasonable-minded people who recognize they have been the victims of circumstances pretty much beyond their control; have resigned themselves to conditions for the present; have sworn "never again"; and have made up their minds to hit the ball, bring all their latent resources into play this coming year to help pull the country out of the hole into which it has been plunged by misguided politicians, international bankers and frenzied financiers.

The past has taught its lessons. A new day awaits the people of this agricultural empire, just as it awaits a new America which in the past thirteen or fourteen years has experienced every kind of economic situation from the heights of war-time prosperity to the depression of a Hoover panic.

Just as those who succeeded best in these past experiences have been the ones who were quick to adjust themselves to the conditions in which they found themselves, so will this section and this nation succeed when they adapt themselves to the new order of events, common sense, prifit, industry, calm judgment, soberness—and above all, aggressiveness, initiative and faith in trustworthy leadership.

The future is certain for these kind of persons, for integrity and eventually right and justice and se-


