Conflict Continues; World Seeks Peace

ARMS CONFERENCE OPENS WITH WAR CLOUDS LOWERING

Handerson Urges Mobilization of Sentiment to Prevent Conflict

Menacing Conditions Exist in the Orient

Mounting Armaments Constitute Threat to Peace

GENEVA, (UP)—A grand mobilization of the world's opinion and a hundred million people assembled here today to exert all their influence to avert war in the Far East. This opening of the conference came as war clouds gathered since before the World war in 1914; gathered in the Orient.

France stands firm. It is bound to refer to the tragic fact that at the moment that the conference is being held, the world is in a state of tension which is to take steps toward the maintenance of peace—justice to the world and to the maintenance of such extreme gravity that now exists in the Far East.

It is imperative that all signatories to the League of Nations should make it the League's duty to insure the strict observance of the terms of the treaty against acts of violence and war.

Most break circle in which world are again in danger of being caught. A sense of insecurity leads to an increase in armaments, and an increase of armaments further aggravates the sense of insecurity.

Need I remind the conference that the problem of disarmament is vitally relevant to the grave economic and financial crisis for which the world is at the moment trying to find a solution? The financial burden of armaments and past wars have hindered one of the main contributory causes.

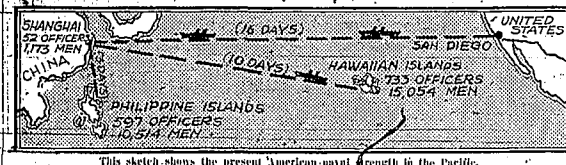

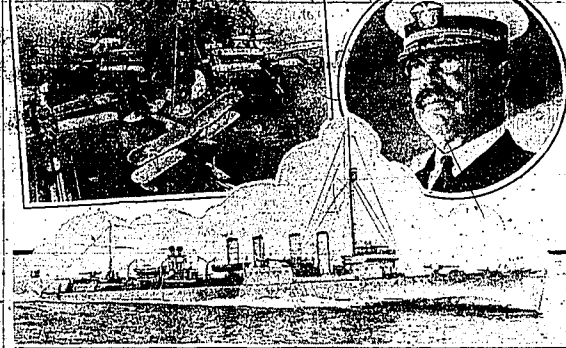
