Boise, Feb. 3.—Byron Defenbach, former state treasurer, today threw his substantial hat into the political ring in announcing his candidacy for nomination on the Republican ticket in the forthcoming primary.

Mr. Defenbach, who was an unsuccessful aspirant for the nomination two years ago, is engaged in the public accounting business. In making the announcement, he says among other things: "I am a candidate for nomination for governor of Idaho, entitled to the will of the Republican voters in the coming primary. I do not contemplate any extension of my term of office, but to know of or will not be party to any deal or compromise, and will make no compromise except upon points of principle and to the benefit of the state as a whole. 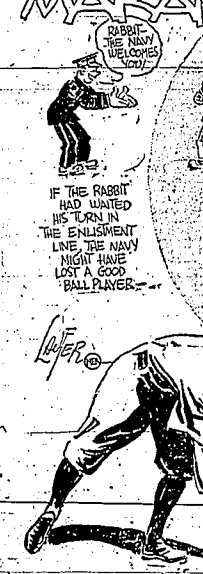

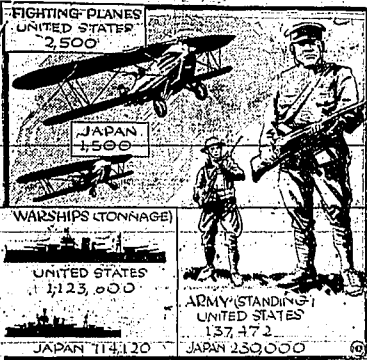

## U. S. EXCELS JAPAN IN AIR AND ON SEA, BUT ARMY IS SMALLER



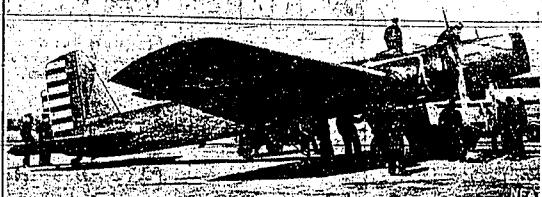
These sketches show comparative strength of the armies, navy and air forces of the United States and Japan. The United States has a superior air force and a heavier navy, but the Japanese have a much larger standing army.

The combined air force of the American army and navy total approximately 2,500 planes and 27,000 men, compared with 1,500 planes and 24,000 men in the Japanese air corps.

The American navy is decidedly superior on a tonnage basis, chiefly because of its 10 battleships. Japan has only 10.

The Japanese standing army of 2,500,000 dwarfs America's force of 137,472, but the actual war strength of either nation is problematical, in view of Japan's compulsory military training and the United States' National Guard and reserve power.

Uncle Sam's most fearsome aerial battleship is this new "flying wing." Capable of carrying a ton of bombs and a crew of four, at 150 miles an hour, this newly built Boeing bomber is shown above as it arrived at Bolling Field, Washington. The motors are in the wings. 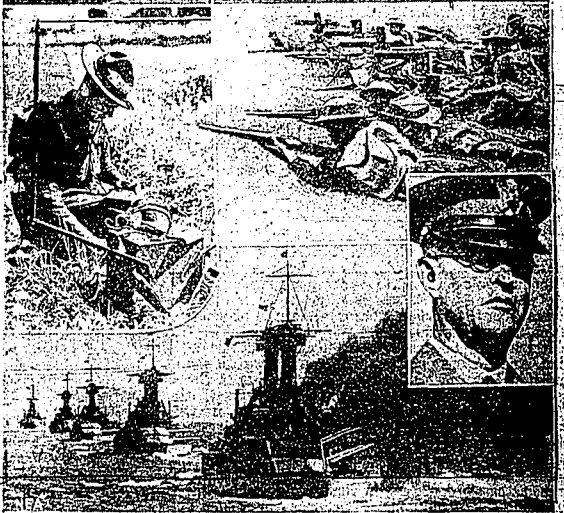

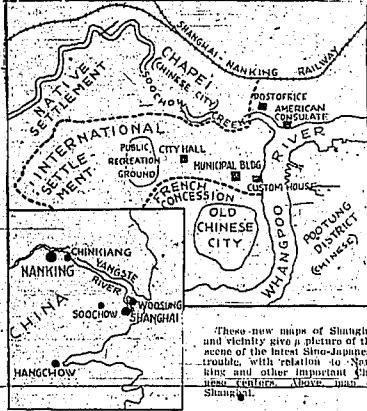

## U. S. ARMY-NAVY PREPARE FOR HAWAII WAR GAMES



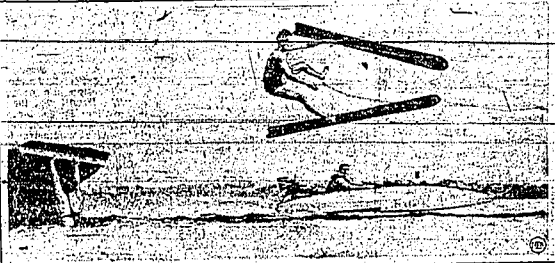

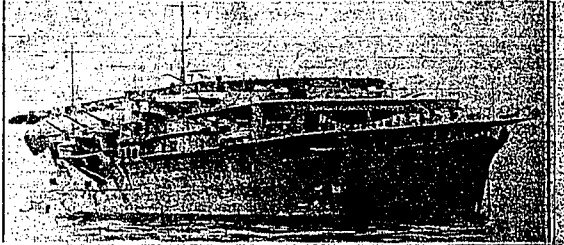

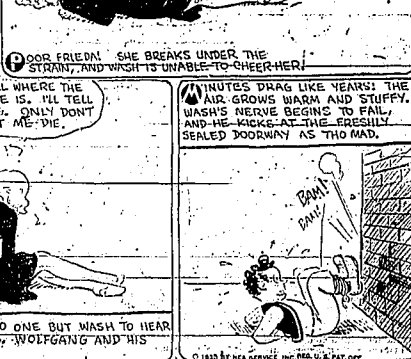

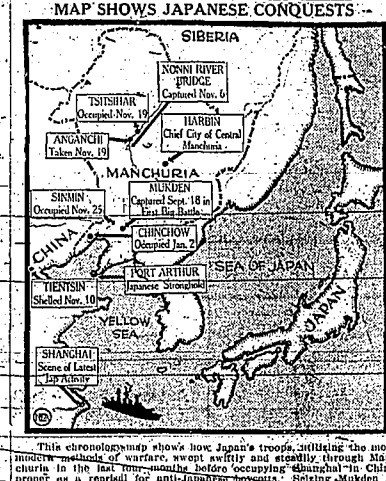
