The battle began at noon. The attacking forces crossed the creek at 3 p. m. (2 a. m. E. S. T.).

### NEWSPAPER BARES ALLEGED RUSSIAN JAPANESE TREATY

Article in London Express Makes Charges of Interest National Pact

LONDON, (UP)—Sensational charges of a secret treaty concluded between Soviet Russia and Japan, giving Japan control of Manchuria, were published in the Daily Express today.

The Daily Express article asserts that the agreement was concluded by Moscow as an alternative to war over the Manchurian situation. It was signed by the Japanese ambassador at Moscow, Baron Goro, and the Soviet ambassador, Count Benckendorff.

The Daily Express correspondent also said that it had been agreed that Soviet interests in the Chinese north Manchuria would be sold to Japan. Japan acquired the railway in south Manchuria in the Russo-Japanese war in 1904-05.

General H. Stalin, Soviet dictator, was said in the article to have approved demands for war by developing the Soviet position. It was in no position to face the increasingly high-organized war machine of Japan.

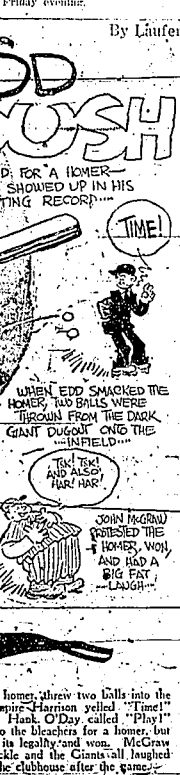

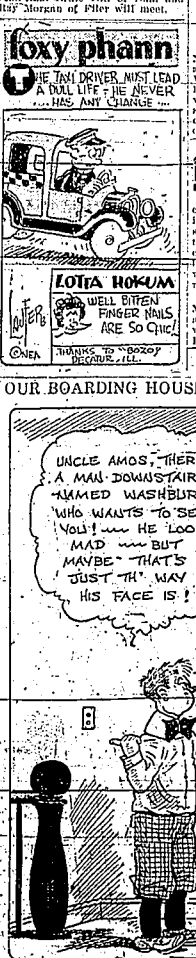

AN ELECTION LOOMS
THE announcements which are now coming in thick and fast on the part of those seeking nominations to congressional and state positions, are having their effect among holders of and seekers after lesser offices.

The period for filing for these offices closes April 23, which is 30 days previous to the primary. As should be well-known by this time every candidate for office in Idaho this year will be chosen by the state primary election method.

In Twin Falls county there will not be as many offices to fill as there were two years ago. For instance there will be no vacancies in the district judgeships, so that is out of the way.

There remains, however, a goodly list of offices to fill in the election, and consequently opportunity for candidacies in the primary, it being understood that each party will conduct primary elections, and that as many persons as choose to (and have the required fees) may file as candidates for the nomination.

In the county the places to be filled include a surveyor, coroner, probate judge, county superintendent of public instruction, sheriff, three county commissioners, assessor, treasurer, and prosecuting attorney, a state senator and three representatives.

In the primaries, voters will also be asked to vote their choice for candidates for inspector of mines, state superintendent of schools, state treasurer, attorney general, secretary of state, supreme court justices, lieutenant governor and governor. Then, because the term of Senator John Thomas is to expire next March, candidates of each party for that job must be voted on.

So, by and large as the saying goes, there is a deal of opportunity here for a little political excitement. To date there have been no announcements of candidacies for county or legislative positions. Just what the desires of the present officials are in the matter, are not yet publicly known, but it is to be presumed that all the present officials from State Senator F. C. Graves of Filer, down to Coroner F. A. Dwight of the same town, will be candidates to succeed themselves.

Diverting as the long-drawn-out campaign will be (some eight months) it should tend to relieve the public of some of the more prosaic subjects which now crowd into the conversation, and keep an apathetic electorate wondering constantly as to who's a what and which. And incidentally it will add to the variety of news in the papers, and transfer the interest of readers from the "war" in the Far East to the battle of the ballots here at home!

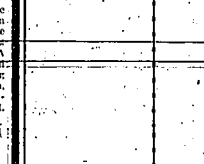

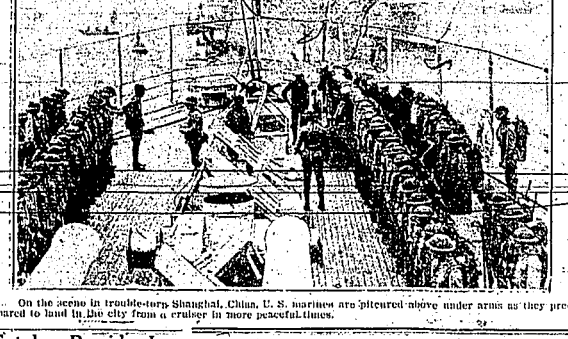
