TREASURY BOND ISSUE FEATURES HOARDING DRIVE

Safe and Secure Substitutes for Ordinary Wealth... COL. FRANK KNOX ANNOUNCES PLANS Campaign Similar to That of World War Period Now Scheduled.

WASHINGTON (UP) - Colonel Frank Knox of Chicago, director of President Hoover's anti-hoarding campaign, formally announced at the White House today that a bond issue to provide "safe and secure substitutes for ordinary wealth" would be offered by the federal treasury to encourage holders back into circulation.

DRIVE OPENS FEB. 25 - The citizens reconstruction organization's campaign to drive hoarding for the benefit of the nation will open Feb. 25 with a nationwide broadcast of advertising. It will be followed by a series of hoarding drives to sell "prosperity bonds."

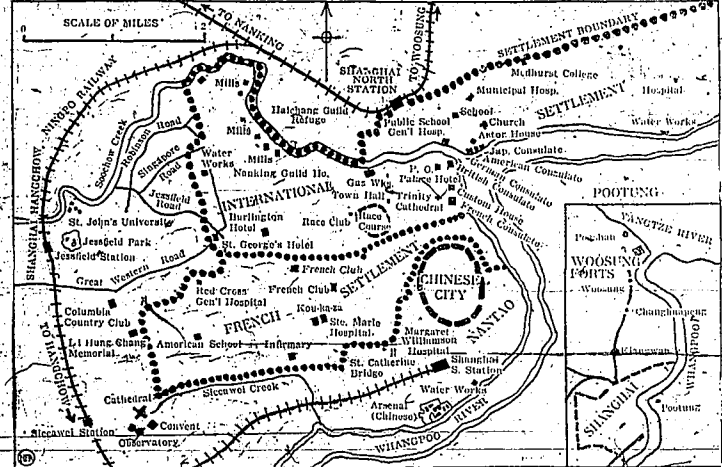
Colonel Knox announced that these reconstruction bonds would be a "safe and secure substitute for ordinary wealth" and that the issue of the bonds would be announced soon.

LOW VALUATIONS BENEFICIAL SAYS BOISE ASSESSOR

Analyze Tax Dollar; Deplores Exemptions; Gives City Levies Per \$100

BOISE, (UP)—Just where the taxpayer's dollar goes is explained by Roy D. Leonardson, Ada county assessor, in the following statement written by him. Leonardson has spent several weeks probing the fate of the dollar in Ada county. He also explains a saving of over \$74,000 to the taxpayers as a result of the 1931 valuation reduction.

"The only other reduction in valuation in 1931 there was a saving to the taxpayers in Ada county of \$74,000. As compared with 1930, there are those who contend there is nothing accomplished in reducing valuations for it takes just as much money to carry on, so if the valuation is reduced the levy must increase. To a degree, this is correct, for it is obvious, that curtailment of expenses must not take care of proportion to the extent that our many branches of government can not be run efficiently and to the better interest of the people.

"However, it is self-evident from the above figures that the reduction in valuation has been beneficial to the taxpayer and until such a time arrives that there are ways and means provided whereby the government expenses are more equitably distributed there must be a holding up of expenditures.

"Too Many Exempts
It is evident that the exemptions far exceed consistency when compared with the total valuation of our state. At present there is approximately \$15,000,000 of tax-exempt valuations, which is now being exempt under the laws of this state which does not include property owned by the various

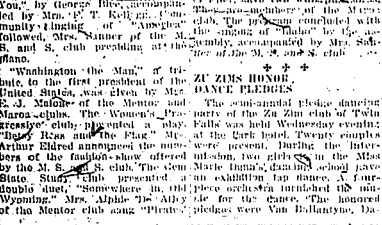

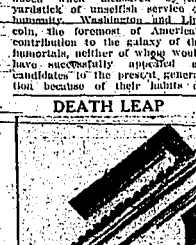

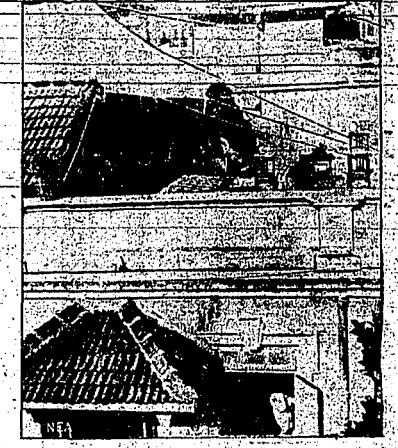
