## Congress Passes Glass-Steagall Credit Measure

### Action Completed On Bill Sent To President

WASHINGTON (UP)—President Hoover today said he would sign the Glass-Steagall Federal Reserve credit bill tomorrow morning.

**SPEDY ACTION**—Congress today completed action on the Glass-Steagall bill to die business with more than 200 yeas and 100 nays and sent the completed measure to the White House for President Hoover's signature.

The House vote within 15 minutes after it opened at noon. The bill was passed by a vote of 275 yeas and 100 nays. The Senate, where it required only a simple majority, passed the bill by a vote of 70 yeas and 23 nays.

The bill, which President Hoover has signed, will be in effect immediately. It is a part of the Federal Reserve system, which President Hoover signs the bill.

## Chinese Planes Fall When Nipponese Bombers Attack

### KARAKHAN CALLS FOR EXPLANATION FROM NIPPONESE

SHANGHAI (UP)—Chinese air forces attacked Japanese bombers today, and claimed they destroyed 14 enemy planes while igniting and crippling battered away at the Chinese line between Tang and Kiangwang.

The Nipponese bombing fleet numbered 25, including heavy bombers, comparatively slow moving fighters.

It was a bombing fleet to rival many seen in action during the world war.

Three Chinese planes were shot down during the sensational air battle over Shanghai today. Japanese claimed eleven other Chinese planes destroyed by bombs, they claimed.

The airport, southwest of Shanghai, is in a hair-bare, and the Japanese claimed they had destroyed the entire Chinese concentration of military planes.
