

No Trace Found of Kidnaped Lindbergh Baby

Chinese Troops Evacuate When Jap Guns Blaze

Defenders Re-establish Their Positions And Prepare To Make Another Determined Stand

SHANGHAI (UP)—Chinese defense troops evacuated their fortifications around Shanghai under a withering fire from the Japanese today and re-established their positions in the rear for another dogged stand.

Chinese commanders of the 15th route of an official defense unit, paraphrasing Commander Perry's "we have not yet begun to fight" as troops completed their orderly retreat to second defense lines.

The Japanese began shortly before expiration of a Japanese ultimatum threatening to blow up the main Shanghai railway line. Within a few hours the Chinese troops were pulled back to fortified positions 20 kilometers (12 1/2 miles) away, just outside a zone around the International Settlement which the Japanese had demarcated they evacuated.

Japanese-armed land, sea and air forces for a driving offensive, being quick advances, also apparently offered the Chinese retreat. Soldiers from the Tainan battle sector, closed in on a Chinese army, committing a killing spree of Chinese arms and munitions.

The village of Tangpuang fell under a dual attack by land and air. Japanese bombers were also attacking the withdrawing defenders with machine gun fire.

A Japanese column from Kiang-wang reached Linying, road in Chappel at 3:30 p. m., meeting a contingent of Chinese soldiers. The Chinese had carefully mined the road and set traps for the Japanese. The Japanese chose to retreat as here we will defend ourselves.

GIRL BELIEVED KIDNAP VICTIM

Flier's Son Has Never Had Ride In An Airplane

LEWISTON, N. D. (UP)—Arrival of the blue-eyed 7 1/2-year-old Lindbergh baby due the birthday anniversary of his mother here June 22, 1931, caused more world-wide newspaper comment than any other birth on the North American continent.

The royal child, for whose arrival a nation waited with anxious anticipation before the birth of Charles Augustus, Jr., was not seen until he was 10 months old.

That despite all the headlines, the baby, Ells Parker, chief of Burlington county detectives and famous for his exploits against criminals, said today.

"On the face of it," Parker told the United Press today, "you can get a pretty good idea of the baby's personality from the headlines."

"I believe they probably will fight clear of New York City," Parker said, "since having conceived their plan, they surely know the other nation would be aroused. So it seems likely that they would pick out a spot in the United States."

"The baby never has been in an airplane," Parker said today. "I expect to say that he has flown, but I don't know if it would be safe enough for me to warrant the use of the word 'fly' or not."

"The Lindberghs have made an effort to keep their son away from the influence of the unparaphrased press," Parker said today. "It was a quiet child, not at all nervous. A visitor in the home reported that the baby was very content for a while that there was a child in the house."

\$50,000 RANSOM IS ASKED IN LETTER

Exact Time of Kidnaping Unknown; Entrant Effected Through Window; No Real Clues Unearthed

HOPEWELL, N. J. (UP)—Charles Augustus Lindbergh, Jr., blue-eyed and fair-haired 20 months old child of Col. and Mrs. Lindbergh was held today for \$50,000 ransom.

Seized in his crib last night as he lay slumbering and in a coil, the baby was taken away by kidnapers, one of whom is believed to be a woman.

With cold during the actual kidnaping crept up a short, sectional ladder into the second floor nursery sometime between 7:30 and 10 p. m. last night, took the child from the cradle, and left behind the ransom demand.

This note, demanding \$50,000 for the child's freedom was reported to police in substance: "We will be back tomorrow (Wednesday) to talk business. Don't talk to the police or the papers."

Col. Lindbergh, in a report, added in searching for the kidnapers, and was requested to personally to enter into direct negotiations for the child's return.

Meaning the kidnaping created a world-wide sensation. Hundreds of thousands of police and military troops were put on foot, watching highways and strict and optical boundary lines. Over the telephone wires of the eastern states and across the continent, the word flashed that one of the nation's most famous babies had been taken.

The kidnapers apparently did not realize the force and extent of the search. Police everywhere went to work with a will to come up with the kidnapers while Col. Lindbergh and Mrs. Lindbergh offered a \$10,000 reward, and the federal department of justice, cameras.


