### Banker Speaks on 'Republic' of Twin Falls at Men's Club Meeting

J. G. Bradley, vice-president of the Twin Falls Bank & Trust company, speaking on the subject of "The Republic of Twin Falls," a meeting held under the auspices of the Presbyterian Men's club in the church parlor Tuesday evening, said the men's committee made a plea for the display of courage on the part of the citizenry in the meeting.

EMPHASIS is this week placed on the great feminine organization, the Business and Professional Women's clubs.

March 6 to 12 over the country is National Business Women's Week, during which time the 65,000 members of the federation are revealing to their fellow-citizens the achievements and the prestige of the organization in the commercial and professional world.

The business elements of the country recognize the importance of the position woman now occupies in the scheme of things outside the home, and accepts her not as a competitor, but as a partner in the business and professional world, filling as she does the many distinctive positions to which she alone is peculiarly adapted.

Twin Falls has a B. P. W. C. which is no small factor in dignifying the position of women in local business and professional circles and its influence is most certainly reflected in the attitude of its members towards their public, their associates, their employers, and their employees.

Peculiarly the National Federation of Business and Professional Women's clubs has no counterpart among the well-known "opp. sex." Just why this is so is not quite clear. True, there is a national chamber of commerce, and there are not a few national and international service clubs "for men only" but there is no definitely national business and professional men's organization, which is to be deplored in view of the manifest benefit, worth and good such a federation is providing for the individual members of the Business and Professional Women's clubs.

#### DEATH FOR KIDNAPERS

THE atrocious shock of the kidnapping of the Lindbergh baby will undoubtedly give tremendous impetus to the movement to establish a federal law to cover crimes of that nature. Such a law would probably be a very good thing to have; but we might do well to pause and think before we write into it the proposed section making kidnapping a capital offense.

The kidnaper, of course, deserves hanging if any criminal ever does. But many police and criminal court lawyers believe that a law providing capital punishment for this crime defeats its own end. The kidnaper knows that if he is caught, the penalty will be no greater if he has killed his victim than it will be if he has kept his victim alive.

It is quite possible that such a law would considerably increase the percentage of fatalities in kidnapping cases. We ought to stop and examine that point before we take any action.

#### SHORT-SELLING

THE question whether or not a man ought to be permitted to sell stock that he does not own is evidently about to become one of the leading issues of the day.

The administration at Washington wants the right restricted; officials of the New York Stock Exchange oppose this plan. And the ordinary man, vaguely distrustful of both politicians and stockbrokers, does not always have a clear notion of what all the shooting is about.

Short-selling is one of those ingenious devices that only a race of very clever traders could ever have thought of. It works like this. You order your broker to sell you for a certain quantity of some stock. You own none of the stock, and on the following day you must deliver the quantity sold to the purchaser. To do this, you simply borrow it from your broker, who is holding it for some unsuspecting third party.

You have now fulfilled your obligation to the purchaser, but you must make good on your borrowing from the broker; so you go into the market and buy stock in order to make delivery to him.

Obviously, the only way in which this is going to be profitable for you is for the price of the stock to decline between the time you make your original sale and the time you have to buy stock to cover your borrowing. If the prices goes down, you make money; if, as now and then happens, it goes up, you lose. If it goes up far enough, you lose your shirt.

The short-seller, consequently, is interested in seeing the prices decline. He thrives on calamity. Frequently, when he sells in large enough quantities, he brings about the very decline that he is looking for.

Stock market experts insist that this custom has its uses. It tends, they say, to keep prices from rising above a reasonable relationship to real values; it tends to keep declines from going to undue extremes, since the "shorts" sooner or later, must buy heavily. It gives the market a needed flexibility.

But as possible abuses are obvious. Unless a very well-reasoned defense can be set up, the general public will probably agree that a curb is needed.



