WHEN Governor Ross says that we are virtually being ruled by financial barons, he is stating what most everyone now agrees is the truth.

America is in the grip of a financial oligarchy which is getting no better fast, and the problem thus created is challenging the best thought of America apparently without avail.

Concentration of wealth is manifestly the cause of the great burden now being borne. It is generally recognized that this is the chief problem. Just how to cure it justly, adequately, is something else.

Desperate measures and tactics are now being pursued with the one thought of getting money distributed. This is the purpose of loans to farmers, of the creation of public works and of the financing of great industrial enterprises.

Naturally this creates debts of one kind or another, while the end to be sought should be less debt instead of more.

Congress might well do well to forget about sales taxes and other means of extracting more money from the ordinary person. Instead it should concentrate on incomes in the higher brackets to the point where unreasonable fortunes are virtually impossible.

What is going on in this country right now is of vital importance to the future. It is to be hoped that radicalism will not hold sway, but on the other hand, there should be no hesitancy in adapting new "departures" made necessary by these new problems which only recently asserted themselves sufficiently to make them serious.

"CATERPILLAR" MEMBERS

IT IS interesting to observe that the latest figures show there are 440 members of the Caterpillar Club in the United States. This "club" as you doubtless know, is composed of men and women who have saved their lives by making emergency jumps from disabled airplanes with parachutes.

The high value of the parachute was never better demonstrated. Without it, aviation's death roll would have been increased by 440 names during the past few years.

Incidentally, the number of "new members" received by this club diminished last year. In 1930 131 persons saved their lives by jumping; last year the total was only 85. Was there less flying last year—or are airplanes getting so much safer that aviators have fewer occasions to use their 'chutes?

EFFICIENCY IN MANAGEMENT

(DAIRY FALLS POST-REGISTER)

LYNN CRANDALL, watermaster for the district, was the unanimous choice of the waterusers of district No. 36 at the annual meeting held Monday. The report of members of the committee of nine to the waterusers paid a high tribute to Mr. Crandall as an executive who has handled his office for the past year at an expense to the waterusers of \$17,062.55 for the distribution of water to over one million acres at a cost of 1.7 cents per acre. A further statement is to the effect that with more water to work with the coming season the cost to the users will be further reduced to approximately \$15,000, or a cent and a half per acre.

The fine business administration, with the good results obtained and the low cost of operation, is a good example of efficiency in business and what can be done through proper management and placing men who are responsible and who know what to do at the head of affairs. A splendid example of business efficiency is shown which could well be followed out through all business affairs, both public and private, with a great saving of expense to those who pay the bills.

In a recent special article, published in the Idaho Statesman, the work performed in the office of the watermaster was outlined showing the intricate and special detail, the serving of many people with water at the same time when that commodity was scarce and in great demand and the fairness and equity of the work performed in the office of the watermaster. An optimistic spirit prevailed at the meeting of the waterusers. Abundance of water for irrigation is assured. The soil, water soaked, will respond to efforts to make it produce. There is every reason to believe that the worst days and time are over with a gradual return to normal conditions which will assure agriculture and allied industries a fair return on the investment of time, labor and money. It has been a tough pull and many have been called upon to suffer greatly. The experience has been bitter, but let it be noted to some degree helpful! If all business, public and private, as well as individual were handled on the same scale of efficiency as that in the office of the watermaster the bad days would not have come. If business and individuals will observe the same good judgment quoted, live and operate within means afforded, the period of probation will be less prolonged.


