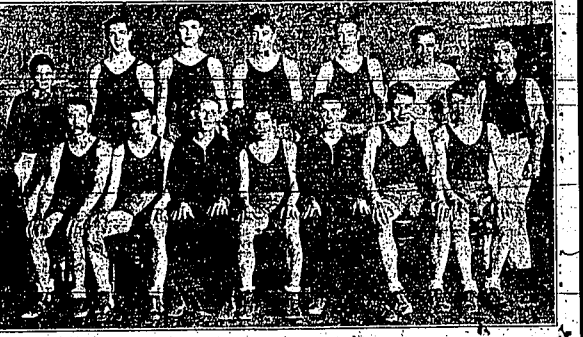

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A REMARKABLE TARIFF INDICTMENT

UNDER the title "The Tariff Policy of the San Francisco Chamber of Commerce," a remarkable statement is made, indicating the present U. S. tariff laws "Our recent tariff acts . . . restricts foreign trade and adversely affects prosperity." It says, "It is not the statement of the Democratic National committee. It is the reasoned judgment of a non-political commercial organization in a neighboring state having at heart only what is good for business, for property, if you please.

Yet it finds that the Smoot-Hawley tariff laws, enacted by the present Republican national administration a serious impediment to normal trade and a burden on the back of American industry the weight of which is unbearable.

Read the statement from the San Francisco Chamber of Commerce:

"We believe that the principle of protectionism judiciously and scientifically applied is sound, but that when carried to the point reached by our present tariff acts, it restricts foreign trade and adversely affects prosperity. Those concerned with the problems of our international economic relations are convinced that our tariff policy since the war is inconsistent with our new position as the leading industrial, financial and commercial nation of the world. As we have restricted imports we have curtailed exports to the serious detriment of agriculture, our mass production industries, and the American merchant marine. Foreign markets are necessary as an outlet for our growing surpluses. Interest on our foreign investments and war debts cannot be paid if we prohibit imports. We must accept the implications of our creditor position and the logic of our industrial advance.

San Francisco is a great port and depends for its well-being on commerce. We believe our hopes for the development of Pacific trade and shipping and San Francisco's harbor will not be realized under our present high tariff policy. Our members engaged in export business are finding increasing difficulty in negotiating business abroad because of the retaliation of foreign governments to our own high rates. Our steamship lines are suffering loss of business.

Because the revival of our foreign trade depends on the liberalization of the commercial policy of our customer countries as well as our own, we urge upon congress the establishment of machinery for reciprocal concessions in tariff rates in the interest of the revival and upbuilding of our foreign commerce.

The sight of Canada's retaliatory tariff against the United States resulting in the establishment of over 100 branch United States factories in Canada is appalling. Furthermore Canada is experimenting with British preference tariff in the hope of making it profitable for the American manufacturer to produce in Canada for export to the British empire. That means the Smoot-Hawley monstrosity is erasing Canada work for Canadian workers in American-owned branch factories. In other words, displacing American made goods in American factories.

As the Oregon Journal says "our prostrated lumber business, almost ruined agriculture and profitless business in many lines resulting from the anger of neighboring nations because of the Smoot-Hawley tariff folly—it is a picture that ought to teach men to think for themselves and their families instead of permitting politicians to think for them."

THE EASTMANS AND KRUEGERS

THE futility of suicide, so apparent to every normal person, reaches the acme of the crime if really is when great public characters such as a George Eastman or an Ivar Krueger resort to human self-accusation.

The old accepted theory that one who suicides is temporarily insane, which while possibly true in isolated instances, is, more's the pity, hardly a legitimate explanation in the average case—more often it is the act of a brazen coward, unwilling to face temporary inconvenience.

More than ever the lesson of suicide to the living is to so live that thoughts of the terrible act will not arise, and further, to so plan and think and train one's self mentally and physically that human blood should not be necessary to maintain a contented, orderly career.

Aside from the unhappiness which suicide causes, the unnatural act is to be deplored for the unwholesome example set for others. But more important still the wanton destruction of their lives by such characters as Eastman and Krueger are to be condemned for the impression necessarily made upon young lives, who have been taught to emulate the characters of the great and successful.

What an ignoble end for a human life! What a terrible example to rising generations!

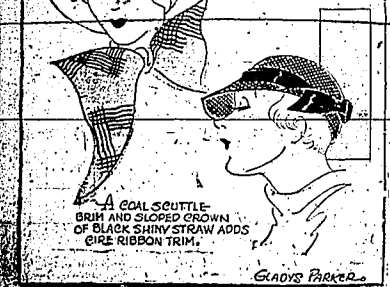
