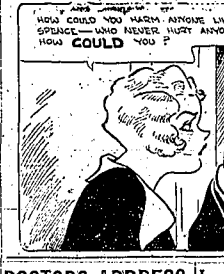

AMERICANS NOW MORE FRIENDLY TOWARD RUSSIA

Relations May Be Restored As Result of Far-East Trouble

WASHINGTON (AP)—The possibility that the present Far East trouble may alter American sentiment toward Soviet Russia is being discussed in some quarters here.

So far, it is authoritatively maintained that the United States has no need to the argument that the United States should remain neutral and that the United States should not be drawn into a war in the Far East. Yet the government has become aware of a more friendly feeling toward it by the Russian press. This may, or may not, lead eventually to a restoration of normal relations.
