Lindbergh Returns from Mysterious Visit Away From Hopewell

LONDON (UP)—The trail of the kidnapped Lindbergh baby was followed with vigor today by Scotland Yard and Major Charles Schoeffel, assistant chief of police at the New Jersey police station.

After a mysterious and secret trip across the Atlantic, Schoeffel conferred with the chief of the New York police and then left on an unexplained mission.

It was reported he had gone to Scotland Yard to interview Mrs. Taylor, mother of the Lindbergh baby's nurse, Betty Gow.

LEADS PUNISHED

HOPWELL, N. J. (UP)—In the Lindbergh case, the trail of the kidnapping of Charles Augustus Lindbergh, Jr., continues in Scotland Yard, where Schoeffel announced today a few hours after Colonel Lindbergh had returned from a mysterious visit away from Hopewell.

The Colonel, garbed in a flying coat and heavy gloves, drove into his office shortly after midnight. He was accompanied by one man whose identity was not certain. Nothing definite could be learned of where the man spent the night or the visit of a companion to Mrs. Violette, Miss, had been considered by some with the trip of Lindbergh.

When this morning Colonel H. Norman Schwarzkopf, superior in the Lindbergh case, was in his regular office, he said:

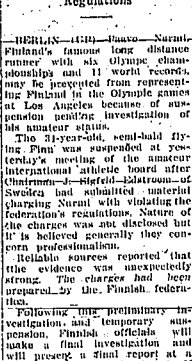

GUARANTEEING BANK DEPOSITS
THE long-suffering people of the United States, who howled so loudly against the proposed sales tax as to cause its defeat, may also force a federal law to guarantee deposits in banks.

It seems probable that the committee will report out a bill which, in view of the recent temper of the House, is likely to pass. Whether it could get through the Senate and escape a presidential veto would depend on the strength of opposition that arose.

"For 17 years," Howard says, "the bank guaranty law of Nebraska worked so perfectly that no depositor in a Nebraska state bank lost a dollar during that period."

Vice President A. P. Pierson of the East Tennessee Bank in Knoxville appeared before Steagall's committee and endorsed the proposal. He said banks shouldn't be permitted to make huge dividends and earnings with which to speculate, but should be constantly strengthened for the protection of the depositors whose money they use to make profits.

Members of the committee also point out that past state guaranty laws have been usually operative in states where the money situation depended on a one-crop system, sometimes creating heavy strain.

MORE FOR OUR TAX MONEY

WASHINGTON correspondents seem to be agreed that something like a "tax rebellion" is sweeping the nation today. Fundamentally, this movement is one of bitter protest against heavy municipal and state taxes. It got into the federal picture when the sales tax was proposed, and it did it because the ordinary citizen felt that there was just one more direct assault on his pocketbook. Back of it there is a widespread feeling that a steadily-rising tax bill is becoming altogether too much of a burden to be borne meekly.
