Planes Droning Over Flier's Home Recall Earlier Air Activity

Lindbergh May Have Received Signals From Skies; Man and Woman With Baby Carriage Excite Suspicion

HOPKINSON, N. J. (UPI)— Possibility that Col. Charles A. Lindbergh today received signals from comrades of the air which might aid in the search for his kidnapped child arose when three planes roared out of the north, circled the mansion twice, and then disappeared in the direction from whence they came.

This recalled the mysterious airplane visits at the start of the investigation, when watchers noted the planes dropped messages.

It was impossible to determine whether the visitors came from the north or south, but the radioed signals could be heard over the entire area.

One possibility is that the planes may have been chartered craft of sightseers but, watchers noted this because of the perfect formation in which they flew and a red, white and blue insignia on the wings, similar to the insignia used on Army and Navy service planes.

CURTIS CLAIMS BABY OF LINDBERGH WAS KIDNAPPED

NORFOLK, Va. (UPI)— Claiming he has established a contact which developed information that kidnapped Charles A. Lindbergh, Jr., is well, John H. Curtis, a retired naval officer, said yesterday he received a telegram from a mysterious messenger that the plane may have come from the Lakehurst naval air station.

The three crafts today appeared suddenly in the north, flying high. They made a short course to the east and then descended to an altitude of about 2,000 feet, circled the house twice and streaked off to the west. The planes may have come from the Lakehurst naval air station.

Optimistic reports of an unconfirmed outline at the house continued. Reports of the imminent return of the child were many and all will be believed until the child is found.



STORY OF FIRST U.S. SHOT FIRED IN WAR NARRATED

Sergeant Wurster Discloses Facts On 10th American Anniversary

(Copyright 1932 by United Press) NEW YORK, April 5.—The first American shot fired in the World War was revealed at Schiff Barracks today by Staff Sergeant Thomas L. Wurster, who said he had fired a .303 field gun that sent a deadly missile screaming over German lines.

This shot, signaling a turn in the tide of victory of allied forces, was fired at 6:00 a.m. on October 23, 1917, and landed behind enemy lines near the front line of the British 4th Division four and a half kilometers distant.

RELATES DETAILS

But not until today, the 10th anniversary of the entry of the U.S. into the war, did Wurster, now a staff sergeant, in the 15th field artillery here, relate the details of that exciting race between the British and French to capture the first engagement in actual combat.

As a member of famous battery C, 4th field artillery, Sergeant Wurster was attached to the Mexican border when war was declared. His veteran unit hurriedly was prepared for service in France and reached the battle front in November, 1917.

Areas had been assigned the various batteries and it was a race to see which would be first to fire. Wurster said he had been on night duty, 19th New York, when his outfit started on its last lap to the front.

A 4th field artillery met them in the little village of Jarville on the outskirts of Nancy, and battle orders were given. They marched to Monchecourt, where the last skirmish of the war was fought, and the guns were turned over to the British.

"We found we had a chance to fire the American army's first shot and we wanted no time going about it," Wurster said.

"The whole outfit of veterans were anxious to fire the first gun and when our platoon chief, the platoon leader, was favored over the old men and dependents of the dead, he said that he wanted to cause the veterans and veterans' wives to feel good and greater."

MILLS CRITICIZES HOUSE'S TAX BILL

SENATE SHOULD CHANGE SEVERAL FEATURES CLAIMS TREASURY SECRETARY

WASHINGTON, D.C. (UPI)— The billion-dollar tax bill passed by the House was criticized by Secretary Mills as an inaccurate measure which did not help to restore business to normal.

Mills' criticism were voiced when he appeared before the Senate finance committee in the beginning of Senate action on the bill.

Mills detailed a number of faults in the bill which he said were changed by the House and declared the stock transfer tax to be excessive under existing conditions.

He also urged that the Senate eliminate the House provision which puts a tax upon dividends received by individuals.

Addressing a meeting of the state chamber of commerce, Senator Calahan of Bear Lake County, said that "when people must pay taxes out of capital instead of earnings, there is no tax."

Calahan urged "reform of the tax laws" and called upon the state chamber of commerce to committee the original treasury tax recommendations presented to the House ways and means committee.

RIOTERS CONTROL ST. JOHNS AFTER UNRULY UPRISE

Acute Economic Situation Causes Grave Trouble In Newfoundland

MOR'S FULL STRENGTH IS PLACED AT 15,000

"It's Revolution" Declares Sir John R. Bennett, Veteran Official

ST. JOHNS, Nfld. (UPI)—Members of rioting crowd at St. Johns, who stopped traffic and sometimes attacked government offices, assailed Prime Minister Sir Richard A. Square, and Sir Herbert G. Hutchings, general of Police Hutchings to prevent them from laying hands on him.

The prime minister's life was saved, probably, by a Catholic priest who was in the crowd.

"This is not a riot, it is a revolution," Sir John R. Bennett, K. C. E., former acting premier and a veteran in service of the Newfoundland government, said as he watched the mob. It was reported that everything movable out of the parliament buildings, attempting to burn the buildings, and uprooting trees, was taken by the rioters to use objects for weapons.

It was reported that Sir Hutchings had resigned but official sources said it was impossible to determine when he did so. Sir Hutchings was beaten and his coat torn.

A NEW IDEA ON CONGRESS
NEWTON D. BAKER's recent suggestion that Congress be kept in session permanently, except for temporary recesses to provide the members with brief vacations, is not quite as startling as it sounds, when you stop to think about it.

Congress, after all, is nothing on earth but the instrument through which the ordinary citizens can express their feelings and control their government. Why shouldn't it be on the job all the time? Isn't that in line with true democratic principles?

Nothing is odder than the way in which certain interests, in recent years, have tried to make people believe that the country is better off when Congress is adjourned. Mr. Baker's proposal may help us to realize how absurd that theory really is.

THE WILSON APPOINTMENT

REAPPOINTMENT of Asher B. Wilson as a member of the state board of education and as a regent of the University of Idaho is a well-deserved recognition of that gentleman's faithful service over a period of five years.

It is known that the position is for the most part honorary—there is no salary attached, and in addition the board is a non-partisan body; Mr. Wilson, for instance, having been originally appointed by Republican Governor Baldridge.

Governor Ross could have gone far afield for a successor to Mr. Wilson, had he so desired, but recognizing the inherent worth of the local man's administration, his unbiased interest, and his zeal for the advancement of Idaho's educational program in a sane and economical manner, and at the same time bringing to the board advantages of his successful business experiences, it is doubtful if the governor could have picked a better individual for the honor.

15 YEARS AGO

WHEN war was declared 15 years ago by the United States against the Imperial German government, the nation assumed the obligation with seriousness and grim determination as became the situation. But few there were with the vision to see 15 years into the future and contemplate the problems which that declaration on day would create.

On April 6, 1917, the anxiety was limited to the physical welfare of combatants; it was not then thought of that this generation throughout the world in 1932 would still be enduring the hardships of war, of war debts, of reparations and moratoriums.

The "gaiety" of marching armies then blanketed visions of hunger marchers in 1931 and 1932.

The "war to end war" was fought with a spirit of confidence that begot patriotism rivaling anything ever experienced by America, and it was believed that the League of Nations would be the stepping stone to world peace, a condition which ironically enough has not existed at any considerable period of time since the Armistice.

Who knows what the situation shall be 15 years from today? It is not to be even hoped that the burdens of the World War shall then have been eliminated, only lessened. But just as the present attitude of the American people is greatly changed toward war, it is to be hoped that the oncoming years will see a furtherance of this spirit.

Mexican banditry now does not call for a punitive expedition and the President is not assailed for "watchful waiting" policies and was Wilson! The suffering and death of defenseless women and children in China today does not arouse our nation's compassion as a similar situation did in Belgium in other years! Wilson's notes, today have found their counterpart in Stinson's statements, but there are no jibes!

We see things differently. Truly we live and learn. As a nation we have grown up, so to speak. Horrible as war is, no one can contemplate its aftermath. Fifteen years ago we had the one; today we have the other; and the President himself says our situation is second only to that of war.

By exhibiting today the supreme patriotism and courage we did during the war, this nation and its people will similarly win its present battle.

It is understood that several of the boys will get into the political scramble so soon as they have the necessary \$19. So often in life that is the case. Those of us who want to do big things cannot attain them because we are poor; while the reverse is just as often true—those with the wherewithal don't want to do anything!


