John H. Curtis Reported to be Aboard Yacht Marcon When It Sailed.

LONE EAGLE REQUESTS MEN CONTINUE EFFORT

Jahle Apparently Makes No Progress; Burrage Issues Statement

HOPKINSON, N. J. (UPI) — None for progress in the search for Col. Charles A. Lindbergh's kidnapped son shifted to Norfolk today with the arrival of the Lindberghs' lawyer, who had been on a mission believed to concern the case.

Reports from Norfolk indicated John H. Curtis, contact man for the northern section of the Lindberghs, had been in touch with the coast guard Marcon, Dean H. Dobson-Peacock, associated with Curtis, offered no explanation of the boat's New York.

Curtis and Dean Dobson-Peacock, both of New York, left yesterday in a plane piloted by George L. Richard, a naval flier. The former, confounded with Col. Lindbergh at his home in Hopkinson, said Col. H. Burrage, third of the negotiators, issued a short bulletin after the three had conferred for two hours following the return of Curtis and the min-

"Me. Curtis, Am. Dean, Dobson-Peacock, and myself, George L. Richard, were all present about 4:30 p.m. (Friday) when Col. Lindbergh, Dobson-Peacock, went to New York, to confer with Col. Lindbergh, who remained at his home in Hopkinson, and the three agreed to go to Hopkinson for negotiations, the cooperation of the press is not attempting to follow him, he presented that they continue their cooperation."

Indicates — Although the men departed on the Lindberghs' boat, after the flier's return from his automobile trip yesterday morning, several clues which flared up during the day were all given out.

CLARK'S WITHDRAWAL

THE withdrawal of Barzilla Clark from the Democratic race for governor, is a logical development, and one which reflects nothing but honor on the mayor of Idaho Falls.

No one is in a position to state just how far Mr. Clark could have gotten in his laudable ambition to become the Democratic candidate for governor of Idaho. That is problematical. Sufficient to state that he doubtlessly has ascertained that the expenditure of much time or effort in the attempt was futile and doomed to disappointment.

Be that as it may, Governor Ross is given a clear field as the one Democratic candidate upon whom all his followers can unite both in the primary and in the general election.

Mr. Clark has proved himself highly deserving of whole-hearted esteem and consideration, not only for graciously eliminating himself as a contender against the Gem State's highly successful governor, but because during the period he was an avowed candidate for the honor of being the party's nominee he at all times conducted his brief campaign on a dignified level, free from personalities and in a manner which elevated him to statewide prominence in the eyes of his party.

That his brief appearance on the political horizon was not entirely in vain, is attested by the respect he has earned for himself politically and as an individual.

It is not to be understood that he has dropped out of the political picture; he just happened to choose an inopportune time to run for an office in which there was already a highly formidable candidate. Perhaps, at some future date he may be willing to let his name come before the Idaho electorate for an office of his choice in which event it is reasonable to assume that it will be a potent name to contend with and one which will command increased and deserved attention and respect.

THE STRANGE CASE OF MR. KREUGER
