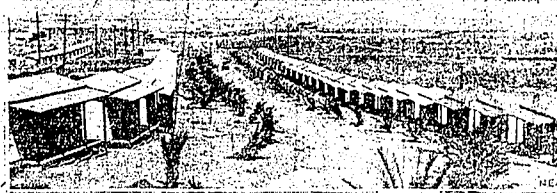

HE WAS FASTER THAN 220 OTHERS IN BOSTON MARATHON



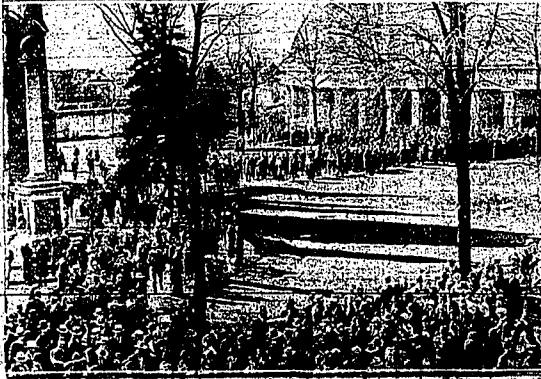

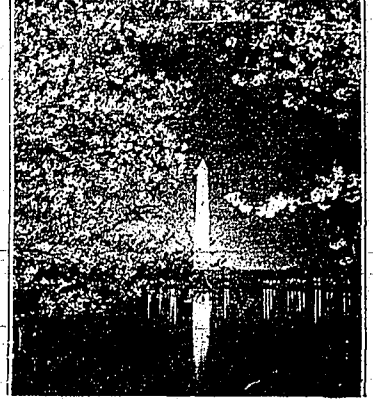

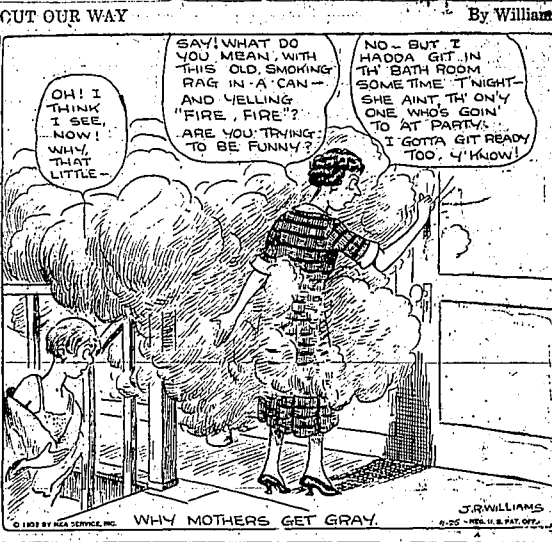
J. H. S. Walton, present deputy sheriff, has filed for sheriff on the Democratic ticket.
