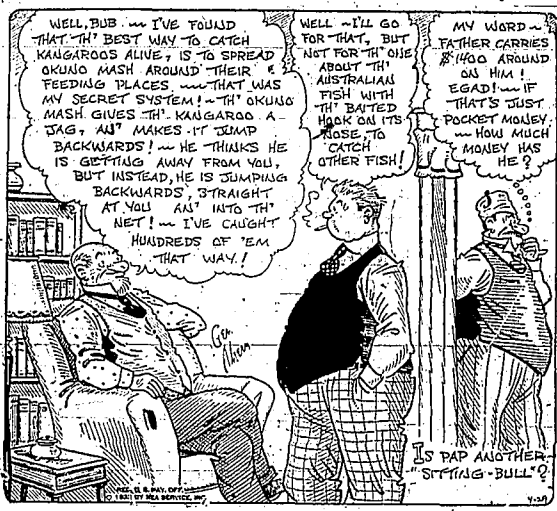

The bomb exploded in front of the Japanese Consulate in Boise, Idaho, on Saturday afternoon. Five Japanese citizens were wounded, including the consul-general, Gen. Kankichi Utsui, who was severely injured. The explosion occurred as a group of Japanese citizens were gathered for a meeting. The bomb was thrown from a distance and struck the building's entrance. The consul-general was the most seriously injured, with wounds to his chest and arm. Other wounded individuals include a secretary and three other citizens. The Japanese military contingent in Boise was alerted to the situation and provided medical assistance to the wounded. The incident has caused a state of alarm among the Japanese community in the region.

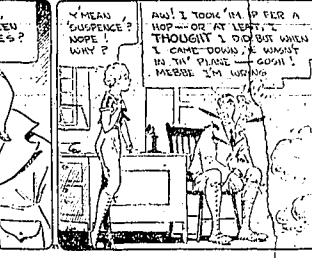

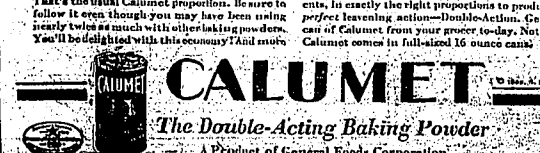

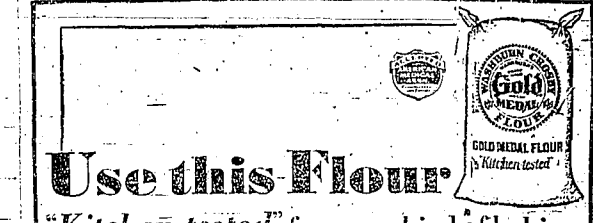

Bound to Be Read

Julio Peterkin has continued her engrossing study of American Negro life in the south in her new novel, "High Noon" (Dobson, Sterrett). The same insight, the same colorful background are present in "High Noon" as they were in her Pulitzer prize-winning "Scarlet Sister Mary." But "High Noon" reveals quite early the promise of the previous book. Something deeper -- an intuitive mastery and interpretation -- is lacking. The writing is here, as fluid and graceful as ever. The scenes and characters are picturesque, but once the story is told the impression survives that Allen Peterkin has missed the farthest of her aim, a living portrayal of causes and conditions. A minor point detracts from the novel. Someone, in editing the book, has interjected a series of fatiguing footnotes. Those explain that "going" means "going" and that "in book" means "in book."

"Meet the Japanese," by Henry Albert Phillips (Appleton), is both entertaining and thought-provoking for those who have never visited the Orient. Its chief merit lies in its presentation of the complex personality of the Japanese rather than in any political implications. There are some good points on modernism as well as a mild dash for the destructive effect of the machine age on the cultural traditions of Japan.

If you're in a cheerful frame of mind and want to stay that way, don't bother about reading "Boy" by James Hanlon (Knopf). But if you'd like to read a marvellous study of man's strength and man's weakness as viewed through the eyes of a 15-year-old boy, here's your dish.

"Boy" tells the story of Arthur Pearson, put to work at 12 by his dull parents. The result is for one day of terror and torture on the docks, his flight to a stowaway aboard a freighter, and his final

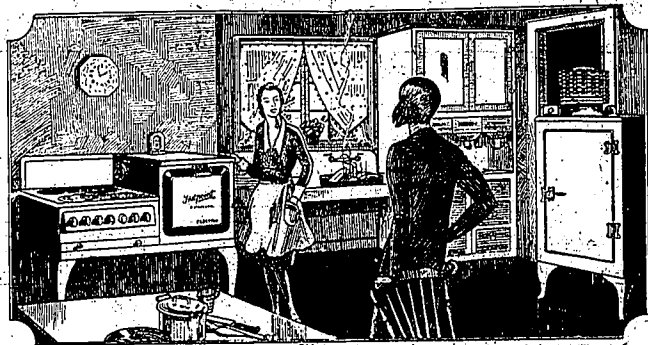

DEPRESSION HITS IDAHO STUDENTS

College Boys Working Hard To Earn Necessary Money at Moscow

UNIVERSITY OF IDAHO, Moscow—Students at the University of Idaho who have had their allowances reduced because of the depression are making their dollars go surprisingly far. Moreover they are supplementing checks from home with part-time employment and they are not "high-brow" about what jobs they will accept. A large number of students report their costs this year much less than what is commonly considered the average.

The sacrifices which students are making—and their determination to stay in college, even if it means foregoing many of the pleasures that to the college heart, has not gone unrequited. The emergency students aid fund of \$7500, raised by Moscow and Boise men, faculty members, and the board of regents, is assisting deserving students. To date more than 100 have been helped from this fund, which is in addition to several others provided by various organizations for the assistance of Idaho students.

Build Homes

Building has increased tremendously. Two enterprising boys built a house on a trailer and loaded it to college with them. They are now living comfortably in these quarters. Fraternities and societies have reduced social functions and the ones held have been of the modest and inexpensive type.

The part-time job field has been developed to the highest degree. Moscow business men have given more work to students and many others have found places in homes. A few enterprising ones have developed entirely new sources of part time income.

While no survey has been made it is estimated by university officials that fully 75 per cent of the present university students are contributing all or a part of their year's expenses.

Ways in which students are earning money on the side to help pay for their college education is further evidenced by the following:

"Washing" the college destination for waiting on tables still holds the list of student occupations taking the head of the parade for men who work in the 24 room houses and dining halls. Next in popularity are clerical and bookkeeping jobs both on the campus and in the downtown business situation.

Most noticeable this year has been the increase in numbers of men and women turning both board and room by working in private homes. Scrubbing the floors
