FEDERAL RELIEF
ON LARGE SCALE
URGED BY BORAH

Dramatic Warning Sounded In
Senate By Senior Idaho
Senator

PLANS TO SUPPORT
COUZENS MEASURE

Opposed to Government Shifting
Responsibility
Through Loans

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Urging that the federal government must immediately face the facts of unemployment relief on a large scale, Senator Frank E. Borah of Idaho, leader of the progressive wing of the Senate, said rather than "begging" the states were uttered in the Senate today by Senator Borah, Repub., Idaho.

"It is war," Borah declared. "The moment has come when the interest and the moral and physical well-being of the citizenship" Borah read to the senate the warning he served upon Mr. Hoover last year that if the administration they would not assume responsibility for orderly operation of the lines nor for disorder that would develop unless something was done.

Government Must Act

"For from being actitators," Borah said, "those men of thought and character, the federal government must assume its part. We can't expect the local communities to deal with that national problem."

He announced that while amending the budget amendment to the tax bill to restore war-time tax income and surtax rates and predicted many taxes now in the works would be more modest and moderate through January, no one "would begin" on large increases.

Opposed to Loans

Borah urged that "that the economy of the country, the employment relief will not bring in a preferable basis on loans to the states or cities." I am opposed of the federal government doing anything by issuing loans.

"There are some cities where the suffering is intense to a degree not to be willing to lend a dollar or distribution by the type of affiliate they have in those cities."

Borah predicted that demands on the federal government for emergency relief would be so great that the tax bill and economy program combined would not provide sufficient funds to meet the needs.

He said that in the next year will be heavier losses thought by those who framed the tax bill and the demands will be an excess of taxation and economic measures which will not \$600,000 would not be sufficient to meet the need for human relief.

THE GLACIERS AGAIN?

WITHIN 2000 years there will be a return of the great glaciers, says Dr. O. Gunnar Eriksen of the University of Stockholm. The climate of northern Europe and America has been growing steadily colder for more than a thousand years; deciduous trees such as the beech and oak have been steadily moving southward, as if to get away from the glacial advance that they clearly foresaw.

Of course, as far as any of us are concerned, a catastrophe 2000 years away might as well be entirely non-existent; but the idea is enough just the same, to give an imaginative man the creeps. The greater part of North America, for instance, down to about the latitude of the Ohio river, was once covered with hundreds of feet of ice. Is that to happen again? If so, what sort of task is the human race to follow thereafter?

HIP, HIP HURRAH!

IF ANYONE expected Byron Defenbach, Republican aspirant for governor, to reveal a note of originality in his campaign and to reveal something bigger and in his campaign and to unlimber something bigger and broader than crass political lingo, he is doomed for disappointment, for this experienced old candidate and campaigner is spilling the same old bunk, vintage of another day.

In attempting to appeal to a group of young voters at Boise last week here is his argument for mounting the Defenbach bandwagon:

Come with us; start right. We point to the fact that our people have never elected a Democratic administration but they have lived to regret it, and to express that regret through their votes on the first opportunity. Come on, now; be in good company. Enlist under the banners of Lincoln, McKinley, of Theodore Roosevelt, of William Borah. Our people are interested primarily in good government; they have come to learn that if we ever have better government, we'll get it through the Republican party.

We are not coming back; neither are we going back. We are going forward—forward and onward. We invite you to go with us in that triumphant advance.

That kind of argument is known as hip, hip hurrah for the Grand Old Party, and is about as logical as saying you are wrong unless you are always with the majority, right or wrong.

A BOLD PLAN

EDWARD A. FILENE'S remarks about automobiles, railroads and business in general before the New York Board of Trade the other day had at least the merit of tackling the back-to-prosperity problem from a refreshing new angle.

Mr. Filene proposed that the railroads be stimulated, "not by crushing their competitors but by giving them competitors worthy of their steel."

Instead of trying to divert business back to the railroads by thinking up new restrictions for other forms of transportation, he would throw the doors wide open, build a vast network of super highways all over the country, make motor transportation cheaper and faster than ever before and challenge the railroads to stand the gaff.

By so doing, he believes, prosperity would be helped in several ways. Transportation would be made cheaper, the huge expenditures necessary to build the new highways would stimulate business, and the existence of the roadways, once they were completed, would create vast new markets for the automobile manufacturers.

Here is a plan that will undoubtedly call forth loud cries of alarm from the railroad men. They can hardly be expected to take kindly to Mr. Filene's assertion that, in the end, the railroads themselves would be benefited by the scheme; their reply probably will be that long before that stage could be reached most of the railroads would be bankrupt.


But the plan deserves attention, if for no other reason than that it is a bold one. Boldness, after all, is one trait that has not been very much in evidence lately. Most of the people who have suggested ways of getting back to prosperity have shown a bent fondness for playing it safe. The idea seems to be that we must, at all costs, avoid any idea that hasn't been hashed over a hundred times before.

It may be that, in the long run, nothing but some bold, far-reaching plan will save us. This particular scheme may not be the one we need, but at least there is nothing timid about it.
