JURY DECIDES TO HOLD AUTHOR OF HOAX FOR TRIAL

Colonel Lindbergh May Appear As Witness Against Norfolk Man

BOAT BUILDER MAY NOT OPOSE CHARGE

Testimony In Case Given At Fleming By Three Witnesses

HOPEWELL, N. J. (UP) — An indictment charging John Hughes Curtis with abducting the Lindbergh kidnaping case, was returned by the grand jury in Flemington today.

The Norfolk boat builder who admitted to building the Lindbergh family by his story of alleged contacts with the kidnappers of the child when in jail at Flemington since his arrest. Prosecution at the case to the jury was made by three witnesses testified to Curtis' hoax.

May Not Oppose Charge. Three unimpaired reports that Curtis would not oppose the charge—merely placing himself at the mercy of the law.

Col. Charles A. Lindbergh may appear as a witness against Curtis if it is held, as was indicated by witnesses, that Curtis should authorities deem it advisable.

Curtis' hoax started shortly after the Lindbergh child was taken from his crib. He reported he had been approached by a man who would pay him \$25,000 to kidnap the child. Curtis enticed the aid of the very Rev. Dean H. Debono, pastor of the First Baptist church.
