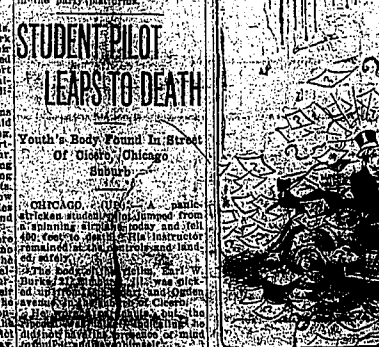

Los Angeles Driver King Of American Speedway; Breaks 500-Mile Record

INDIANAPOLIS, (UP) — Fred Frame, 37-year-old Los Angeles driver, who has been racing for 10 years, today was king of the American speedway.

Averaging 104.44 miles an hour in his tan-colored Miller Hartz front wheel drive special, Frame completed the grueling, 500-mile race in 4 hours, 49 minutes, 37 seconds, the fastest speed ever made in the Indianapolis event first held in 1915.

Howard Wilcox, Indianapolis, second at 100 miles, finished second at 200 miles, and third at 300 miles. During the last 25 miles of the race, Wilcox was hit by a crowd estimated at 150,000.

Umpire-Player Battle Probed

Sensational Fight May Result
In Suspension of Chicago Players

(MILWAUKEE, Wis., May 30) — The most sensational attack on the umpire in major league baseball history may result in suspension of several Chicago White Sox players, according to reports from Milwaukee.

Investigation was started into the assault upon Umpire George Moriarty.

William Harridge, president of the American League, and officials of the Cleveland Indians and Chicago White Sox, are expected to meet in Chicago tomorrow morning to discuss the attack on Moriarty.

According to Cleveland players who have escaped the umpire from the field and tried to hurry Moriarty to his dressing room before trouble occurred, Charlie Berry, Sox catcher, and former all-league outfielder, accused Moriarty of "missing" a strike on Earl Averill, right fielder, on the 234th out.

Moriarty suffered an injured hand when he hit Milton Gammon, Sox pitcher, on the head with a bat. Moriarty was taken to the hospital and his body bruised in the assault by at least four White Sox players. Moriarty said his wounds were not serious although he was hospitalized for several days.

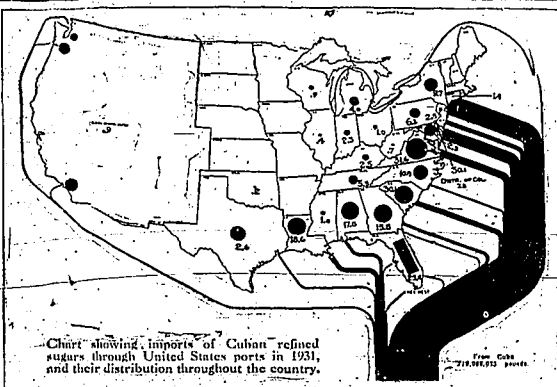

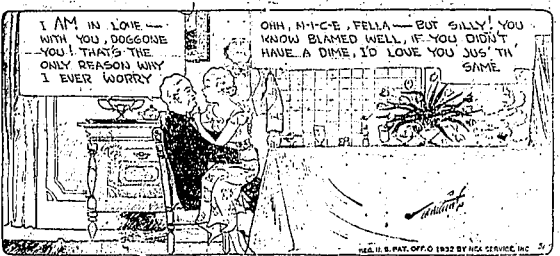

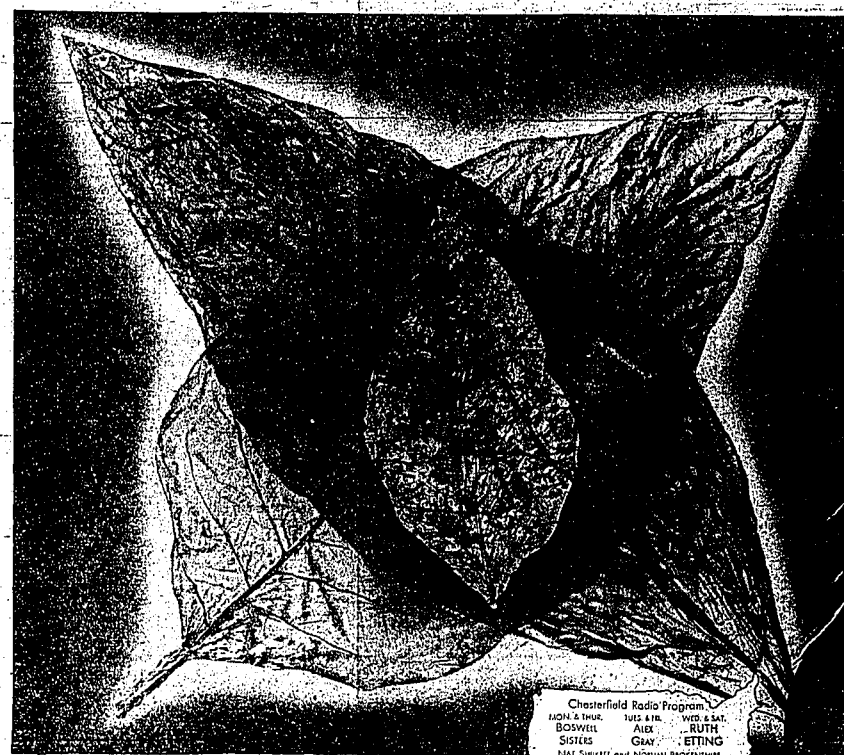
