



### WHY WE HAVE THE STRADDLE

Discussion of the big political conventions always leads one, sooner or later, to wonder why it is that ordinary men seem to lose the power of forthright expression when they meet together for political

The straddle has become the curse of American politics. It is not peculiar to one party; it affects both parties equally, and has gone so for to long that the ordinary citizen has ceased to expect either party to issue a clear-cut, hard and fast pronouncement on any matter that is in the least controversial.

ment on any matter that is in the least controversian.

But this in itself would not be quite so had if it did not indicate another fault that goes much deeper.

Straddling is merely a symptom indicating that each major party is a conglomeration of discordant elements. There cannot be unity in our parties because each is composed of diametrically opposed factions; and it is humanly impossible for them to agree on any important issue. agree on any important issue.

The Republican party, for instance, contains such men as Senator Norris, Senator Borah and Senator LaFollette on one hand and President Hoover, Sen-ator Reed and Calvin Coolidge on the other.

Likewise, the Democratic party contains both Al Smith and ex-Senator Hellin; both Jim Reed and Newton D. Baker; both Owen D. Young and Governor Murray.

Unanimity of party opinion, in these circumstanc-

But our democracy is based on the two-party sys tem—if not constitutionally, at least in practice. And the two-party system cannot work properly unless there is both party loyalty and party responsibility.

there is both party loyalty and party responsibility. With the parties lined up as they are, this loyalty and responsibility can only appear once in a blue moon. And that, more than anything else, is why Congress has been fumbling the balf during the present session. It is why the politician straddles. It is why party platforms are meaningless.

We need some sort of realignment. Until we get it, representative government will not run smoothly.

They tell us that congress and the administration at Washington have at last balanced the budget by appropriating 1115 million dollars. Is that so? Where did they get the money? It is a mighty easy job to appropriate money—to spend it. It's another matter to earn that money. Visiting in Portland one evening last week with a group of dairy leaders, Sani H. Greene, secretary of the California Dairy council, proposed a new cam-

paign.
In brief, it was that towns in dairy districts promote the greatest possible consumption of their own dairy products and reduce to the minimum the exportable surplus.
This campaign already has been launched in California. It has been proposed in Idaho and in Montane.

Montana.

The explanation is, of course, that during the difficult days through which farmers have passed dairying has held up better than any other agricultural industry. The low prices of feed, the increased quantity of feeds grown on the farm, the sustained consumer demand, due in large part to improved quality and the comparative reliability of returns, have all been inducements to turn to dairying. Los Angeles and San Francisco, California's great markets, have consequently been flooded. The secretary of the California Dairy council hazarded the

The secretary of the California Dairy council hazarded the prediction that to maintain the present rate of shipments would lower the San Francisco market 3 cents a point below the Chicago market, where last week the quotation was 16% cents.




