HOUSE EXPECTED TO RECEIVE FROM STAND

Action Destroys Hopes For

Washington, (UP)—Senate and House conferees today concluded on the \$2,500,000 relief program and decided to report a compromise bill back to their respective houses.

The action almost certainly destroyed all possibility of a congressional adjournment tomorrow, and left the possibility that conferees will carry next week to settle the question.

PLANS FOR PUBLICITY

The conferees agreed on the provision in the bill except the one for publicity on future Reconstruction Finance Corporation loans.

The House conferees insisted on a House provision for publicity on all loans. The Senate conferees refused to accept this and the conferees failed to agree on the publicity provision.

House floor leader Rainey said he would bring the matter up in the House tomorrow, with a probable recommendation that the House decide to stand on publicity, with an amendment. Senate leaders hoped, however, that the House could reach a decision today.
