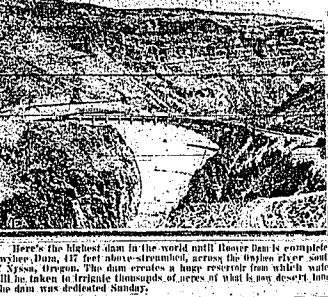

GOVERNMENT BEGINS VAST DRIVE IN WAR AGAINST DEPRESSION

WASHINGTON, (UP)—The federal government is mobilizing today in the nationwide war against depression, a combination of credit, unemployment relief and expanded currency aggregating \$1,922,600,000.

The impact of this vast combination against stagnant business is expected to arouse commerce to new life.

Congress put these weapons in a President Hoover's hands Saturday by enacting finally the home loan bank and employment relief bills. Mr. Hoover will sign the relief bill tomorrow.

Unemployment relief provides \$2,122,000,000 divided among projects for direct human relief and construction of public and self-liquidating projects.

The purpose of currency expansion is to increase commodity prices which means to decrease the purchasing power of the dollar.

Mr. Hoover has not committed himself formally to currency expansion but Congressional leaders were confident Saturday that he would sign the bill with the expansion rider.

There are two limitations. First, no bank will receive more than \$25 million in new currency.

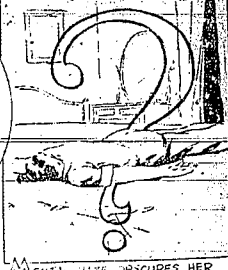

## Youth Slain as Strikers Battle Ohio Mine Troops



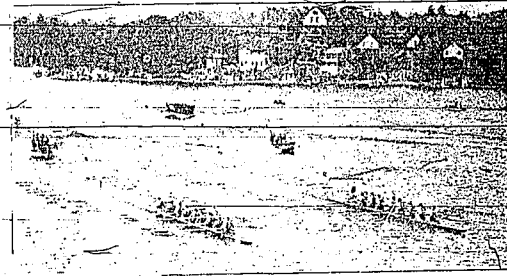

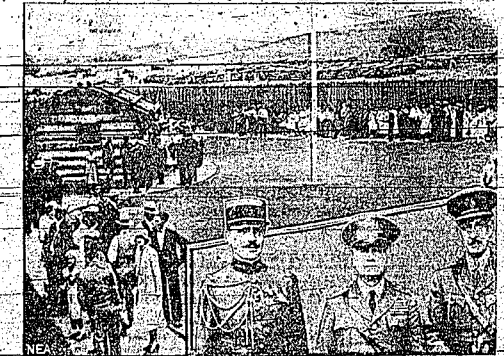

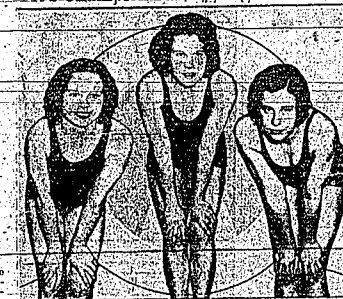

## So "Fort Necessity" Won't Be Forgotten—



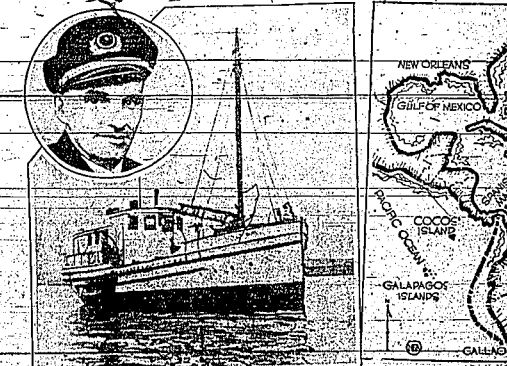

### LATE SPUD CROP ESTIMATED MORE THAN LAST YEAR

Figures Larger For Both Acreage and Production Says Report

WASHINGTON, July 18.—The estimated increase of potatoes in the 18 best producing states is 2,211,000 compared to 2,165,000 acres in 1931. The production is estimated July 1, 1932, at 27,250,000 bushels, compared with the actual 1931 production (revised) of 26,821,000 bushels in those states. The average yield per acre is estimated 1932-1931 was 24.12, compared to 24.12 bushels.

### IDAHO CROP PRODUCE EXCEEDED BY ALPHONSO

By James Jacobson, U. S. Statistician, Idaho

HOUSE.—With ample irrigation water, supplies and excellent soil conditions all through planting season, Idaho farmers have made full utilization of their acreage. The result is that with the exception of beans, peas and potatoes, all crops are growing on a larger acreage than last year.

White wheat is practically normal in production—4,100,000 bushels—against 4,211,000 last year. Last year's crop of 4,500,000 bushels is the single which is not double last year's 2,250,000 crop. Most grain crops of corn, oats, barley and rye are forecast at 12,750,000 bushels in comparison with 12,240,000 in 1931. The 1932 crop of 2,925,000 tons of wheat is 250,000 tons more than last year's 2,675,000 tons. A decrease of annual production in acreage planted accounts for only 1,000,000 bushels more than last year's crop of 2,000,000 bushels. Idaho average yield per acre is 24.12 bushels, 21.6 bushels last year. July 1 conditions last year 21,200,000 bushels were harvested. Poor ballistics weather last spring has largely responsible for cutting apple production to 4,000,000 bushels.
