BLOODY CLASHES ADD TO TOLL OF GERMAN RIOTING

Government's Drastic Rules
Fail to Prevent Serious
Political Disorders

MONTH OF FIGHTING
CLAIMS 100 LIVES

Twenty Persons Killed During
Outbreaks Sunday and
Monday

BERLIN, (UP) — Bloody clashes between Communists and Fascists today sent the death list for political warfare soaring to 100 or more in the month since the ban on uniformed political organizations was lifted.

The latest clashes resulted in the death of 20 persons, including 10 Communists and 10 Fascists, and government threats of a crackdown on all persons carrying unlicensed firearms in process.

Attack Parade

The government decrees were less than 12 hours old when the "storm troopers" of the "National Front" attacked a Nazi parade in Berlin, killing one Nazi and wounding four others.

The attack was similar to the fighting that broke out in Berlin, where 10 persons were killed and scores were wounded.

The "Altona" attack in Hamburg, Germany, to quell the political disturbances.

Deaths of fighting, however, reached their highest point in the last few days.
