

Athletes Swing Into Third Program; Nine Records Established

Metcalfe Apparently Winner; But Tolan Gets Credit

FINN TRIUMPHS

Track and field athletes of the Olympic games, with nine new records, swung today into their third program, and further wrecking of existing marks was in prospect.

Establishment of records today had become something of a habit since the boys and girls posted five new marks in the seven events of Sunday, and made four in yesterday's five competitions.

There are the four newest achievements:

The 102 dash of Edith Tolan, Detroit, in the 30-minute final. This set the world's record, and broke the Olympic mark of 1:02.4.

New World Record—Stella Wagner's mark of 1:11.2, twice recorded by the Polish philosopher in the women's 100 meters. This was also a new world record.

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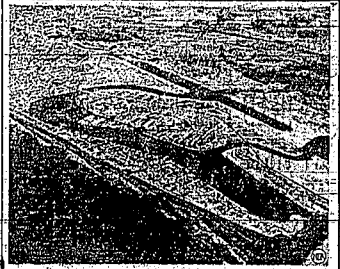
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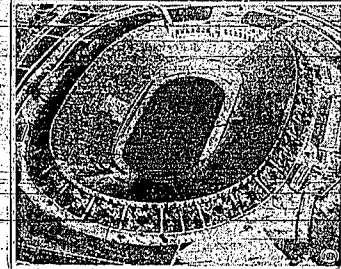
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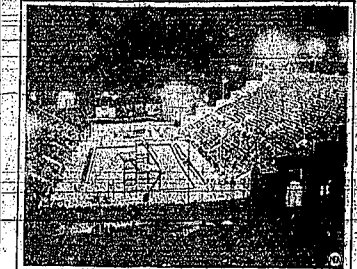
WHERE WORLD ATHLETES ARE FIGHTING FOR OLYMPIC FAME
