Hitler's message read: "The action was taken as an open defiance of the Reichstag, and the government's action to set up arbitrary courts to handle cases involving political prisoners."

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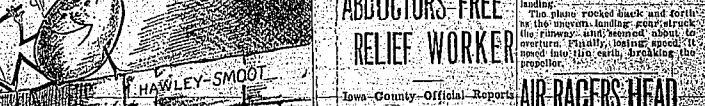
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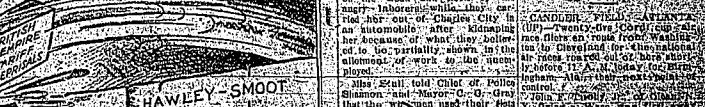
