

Gar Wood Flashes to Victory Over English Challenger, Kaye Don

Miss America X Wins First Speed Event by Two Miles

DEFENDS TROPHY

HARMSWORTH COURSE, LAKE ST. CLAIR, Mich., (UP)—Gar Wood, American defender of the Harmsworth trophy, flashed to victory today in the first 35-mile heat of the famous race after trailing Kaye Don, the English challenger, for four of the

five laps.
Wood's Miss America X, the 45-cylinder racing unit, crossed the line a full two miles ahead of Don's white-headed Miss England 111.

Chopping water and rala which turned from drizzling to a steady downpour midway in the fourth lap, slowed the race to a halt.

Wood's average for the 35 miles was 78.63 miles an hour, far below the record set last year by Don in Miss England 111 when he averaged the distance in an average of 55 miles an hour.

Wood took his Miss America X back to his Grayton home immediately after the race, and Don headed Miss England for the Henry B. Joy boat house.

"I ran the race just as I planned it," Wood said. "The boat worked perfect to over raly and I am delighted to have you today, and I believe we will repeat the victory Monday and Tuesday."

Until midway in the fourth lap the Miss America looked like a heater-boat. Don had brought Miss England over the starting line well in advance of Wood, and opened up a lead of more than a mile on the first lap.

GOLF

When your ball has found its chippy lie, it is almost impossible to insert the blade of the club beneath the ball cleanly without the moving cone of the soil behind the ball during the process, in which case only a "blow" can be inserted. When a washie is used, this mistake is to be avoided. The ball should be pitched short of the green and allowed to run.



The left hand should grip firmly and the ball should be driven out by the strength of the left arm.

Do not open the face of the club-head on the backswing as in the pitch shot. The flight in this case will be lower.

DEFEATS WORRY YANKEE MANAGER

New York Club Loses Second Contest to Washington Senators, 7 to 1

NEW YORK, Sept. 3.—The New York Yankees today had to beat the Washington Senators by playing the 127th contest since the season began and their manager, Joe McCarthy, wants to know what it will take to win the American League pennant, and we've dropped two games straight.

Although Manager Mike Scully has a first-place lead of nine and one-half games over the Philadelphia Athletics, Joe's doubtful team slipped out of his hands.

The New Yorkers' long lull in the attack ended though because of the position record, established in 1924 by the Boston and Philadelphia clubs of the National League.

The Athletics' bid to get seven more runs as they took two games from the fall-and-rod Sox, 7 to 5, and 10 to 5.

The Browns downed the Chicago White Sox 3 to 1. They were the only American League games scheduled.

Chicago's post-man-hand, this preceded their winning streak in 12 straight games by trouncing the Cardinals, 8 to 5.

This evening the Cubs in a dominant run averaged one-half game. Yesterday they beat the Pirates, who beat the Reds, 2 to 1. It was Pittsburgh's sixth straight win.

They were the only games scheduled.


