## DEFENDS TROPHY

HARMSWORTH COURSE, LAKE ST. CLAIR, Mich., (UP)—Gar Wood, American defender of the Harmsworth trophy, flashed to victory today in the first 35-mile heat of the famous race after trailing Kaye Don, the English challenger, for four of the

five laps.  
Wood's Miss America X, the 45-cylinder boat on a steady state of heating coils, crossed the line a full two miles ahead of Don's white-hulled Miss England III.

Chopping water and rala which turned from drizzling to a steady downpour midway in the fourth lap, slowed the pace of both boats.

Wood's average for the 35 miles was 28.63 miles an hour, far below the record set last year by Don in Miss England III when he averaged the distance in an average of 55 miles an hour.

Wood took his Miss America back to his Graydon home immediately after the race, and Don headed Miss England for the Henry B. Joy boat house.

"I ran the race just as I planned," Wood said. "The boat worked better than ever today. I am delighted to have won today, and I believe we will repeat the victory Monday and Tuesday."

Until midway in the fourth lap the Miss America looked like a heater boat. Don had brought Miss England over the starting line well in advance of Wood, and opened up a lead of more than a mile on the first lap.

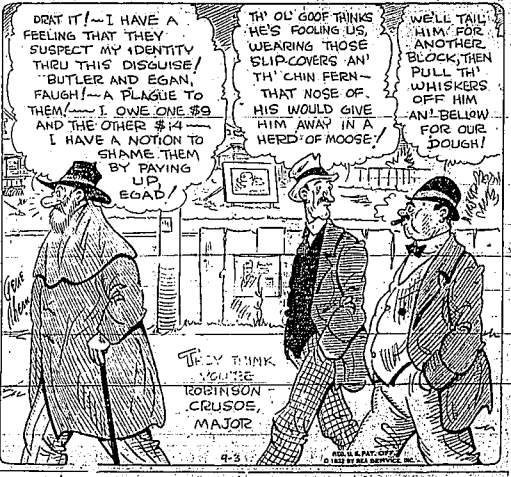

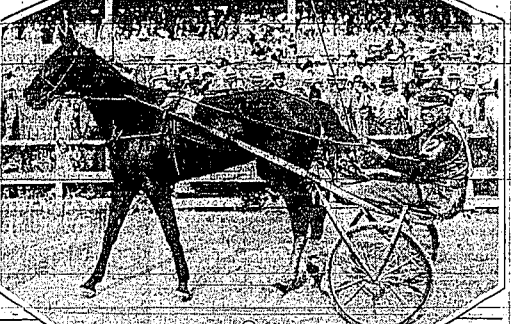

# GOLF



When your ball has found its chippy lie, it is almost impossible to insert the blade of the club beneath the ball cleanly without the moving cone of the soil behind the ball during the process, in which case only a club backer can be inserted. When a wafer is used in this stroke, it is possible to split the ball to the green. The ball should be pitched short of the green and allowed to run.

The left hand should grip firmly and the ball should be driven out by the strength of the left arm.

Do not open the face of the club-head on the backswing as in the pitch shot. The pitch in this case will be lower.

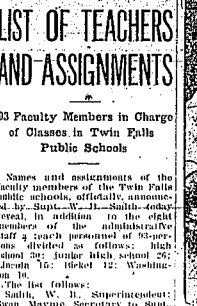
