CUBS LEAD BY 6

NEW YORK (UPI) — A pair of double-headers today may prove important in the race for the National League pennant here.

The Chicago Cubs, enjoying a fine field of six games, will host the Braves in a twin bill at Wrigley, and the second place Pittsburgh Pirates will meet the Brooklyn Dodgers in a double session of six.

Cubans have won nine games to place Pittsburgh fifth, only two games behind the last nine of the entire season to be highly important.

Although the Cubs lead by six games and have two more contests, they should not let Chicago's lead down to four games, it would tighten the race, and the Cub fans probably would eat the Cub confetti.

As yesterday was traveling day, the only competition was between the Indians and the St. Louis Browns. The Indians took hold

of the lead after a clean sweep of their four-game series.
