

And again: "But behold Borah from Idaho, the state that glorifies in his magnificent dignity, that grins embarrassingly in his reflected glory that regards him with the distant pride of the hen whose setting produced a peacock."

Perhaps we of Idaho are supposed to get mad, or something. Let's don't. Let's laugh. Borah'll laugh. Apparently Author Davenport didn't get around to talk to any of the thousands of Idahoans who look upon their senator as the gentlest, kindest, most neighborly of friends.

The only serious political note struck in the entire article relates to Senator Borah's declaration that he would support Senator John Thomas for re-election. Still quoting the mythical citizen of Idaho (who has met "on the court-house steps") Davenport makes himself say:

It ain't John Thomas that Bill's so all-fired anxious about; it's Bill himself.

"What has Senator Borah to fear?" asked Davenport. "Well," drawled the pictorial movie-version Idaho farmer, "I don't suppose anything's closer to Bill than that chairmanship of the Foreign Relations committee is. That there place is Bill's liver and lights. Bill's got a feeling that we're going to elect a Democratic president and, while he don't love Herbert Hoover any, he ain't anxious for a Democratic candidate to take the senate with it. If it did, where's Bill's job as chairman?"
