

Joe McCarthy's Nine Needs Four Victories To Eliminate Rivals

Yanks Increase Lead to 13 1/2 Games Over A's

CHICAGO GAINS

NEW YORK, (UPI)—Four victories in their remaining 12 games will bring the New York Yankees permanent lead over the Chicago Athletics, but four more are needed to blot out the third-place Washington Senators from the pennant picture.

Joe McCarthy's Yankees increased their lead to 13 1/2 games over the A's yesterday when they defeated the Athletics in the first game of a schedule double-header from Detroit, 6 to 4 after 14 innings. The victory was called at the end of the seventh because of darkness with the score 7 to 7.

The Athletics dropped a 2-1 decision to Cleveland, where Clint Hurr limited the A's to four hits.

Yankee leader Ben Hoenes in four hits while winning his 20th game of the season for Washington, 7 to 7.

Chicago's White Sox improved their record to 10-10 with a 1-0 victory over the St. Louis Cardinals. The Cubs extended their National league lead to five and one-half games over the Pirates by splitting a seven hit with Boston while the Pirates lost a game to Brooklyn.

Bruce Suter, Chicago left fielder, dropped the Athletics, 4 to 2. Brooklyn crushed the Pirates, 10 to 5.

Harv Henge limited the St. Louis Cardinals to three hits as the Phillies splashed them, 3 to 0.

Yesterday's hero: Lefty O'Doul of Brooklyn who drove in four runs with two homers and two singles in four tries, raising his batting average to .376. He costered the 3,000 hit of the season.

USE HOME PRODUCTS

There is more than one angle to the home products argument. Ordinarily the idea is coupled only with the use of brooms, or potato chips, or printing.

It is emphasized strongly in the case of sugar, which is raised here in the form of beets and converted into a usable food product right at our own doors.

Every loyal community resident endorses the policy of using such home products, for it pays in dollars and cents. Not everyone carries the program for enough. Everything that is grown or produced in this valley should have first consideration from buyers.

Not only should local flour and hams and lard and sugar and butter come first. But local garden truck, fruit, melons should be demanded. At the present time a big local peach crop is being placed on the market.

Your merchants will thank you for your cooperation, and you, in turn, the grower, will appreciate the policy. This all tends to keep money at home—to help restore the balance of trade between our little 'nation' and the outside world.

A NEW ANGLE ON THE 'TWO JOBS' CLAUSE - Broken homes—separation of husbands and wives and in some cases divorce—are resulting, according to a Washington dispatch, from the 'married persons' clause of the government's new economy act.

This is a serious question because the question of employing married women has arisen in city and state offices, schools and industries throughout the country. It would seem to be the impartial observer that, with jobs as scarce as they are, one each to any family is enough. The National Women's Party, opposing the 'married persons' clause, has collected facts showing another side of the picture.

Among the cases cited by this organization are a husband earning \$1911 and a wife \$1248 who contribute support to 14 people; another husband earning \$1900 and wife earning \$1640 who are buying a home they will lose if their income is reduced.

"I feel quite certain that some suspicious which I have entertained of late relative to the safety of my life are not without foundation," the young wife's letter began. It told how, a few days before, she had detected Moore in the act of placing a strange capsule—presumably containing poison—among some capsules of harmless medicine that she used. When she confronted Moore, he took the capsule away from her so fast Mrs. Moore spoke of information contained in another letter, but this mistake has not been found.
"I was held in jail at Marshall, Ill., recently confessed. The man who was driven to the deed because he preferred a 'man loving wife' to his cultured companion who excelled him as a teacher."




