PRESIDENT SPURS PARTY'S LEADERS TO NEW ACTIVITY

Republicans Greatly Disappointed Over Outcome of Maine Election

EXECUTIVE ADVISED TO MAKE MORE SPEECHES

G. O. P. Expects to Reverse Maine Results by Redoubling Efforts

WASHINGTON (UP)—Concerned over the Democratic victory in Maine, President Hoover has taken on the lead in personal appeals to Republican leaders to greater campaign activity as Governor Roosevelt swings into a trans-continental speaking tour.

"We have a strong case and a right cause," he declared in a personal message to the national leaders of the Republican national committee.

He said Republicans had fought all along that owing to the fairness of the vote depression the right would be made to make that the result in Maine indeed need for stronger efforts to be made.

At the same time he declared, confidence of reconstruction efforts transcended all personal and partisan considerations.

World Expansion Program

Some of Mr. Hoover's advisers were urging that he expand his speaking program beyond the United States to include other countries.

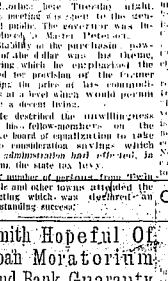

"With respect to this," he declared, "I propose to exert through the presidency such influence as I can, in favor of a national movement to reorganize local governments in the offering of simplifying some of the tax laws which now bears so heavily on citizens."

Most Re-Finance
The governor cited the necessity of re-financing farm mortgages if the operations of the nation are to prosper. He pointed out that while the last session of Congress did a great deal toward re-financing and stabilizing farm mortgages and loans, practically nothing was done by that body toward removing the destructive menace of debt from farm homes. A program of bringing about prompt governmental effort, a substantial reduction in the differential between the prices of the things the farmer sells and the things he buys, was demanded by the candidate in an immediate necessity.

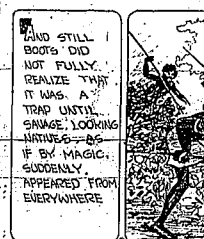

place on top raw potatoes very thinly sliced—about ten minutes before dishing up—about one cup cream. This dish may be made with veal or pork. Cook covered. The tongue cooked the better about two hours. A chop loin may be used.

Sauce Beans, Spanish
If fresh string beans are used, choose very tender ones, about one quart. Wash the beans, scrubbing them thoroughly. Fry gently in three tablespoons fat, stirring constantly. Add to two tablespoons fat in another pan one onion, sliced or more, two green peppers, chopped, fry until yellow and then add six medium sized tomatoes or one pint canned tomatoes. Add beans and a little water if mixture seems too thick. Season with salt and pepper. Simmer one hour or longer in slow oven, one and one-half hours, thinned with flour mixed with a little cold water. If served with plenty of grated cheese, it will not be a main dish. In using cut and beans they may be added directly to the tomato mixture.

Basatin Salad
Arrange in a low bowl or a large salad plate. Peel three whole large cold potatoes, cut in white strips, one of leeks, one of cauliflower, one of peas or use frozen vegetables. 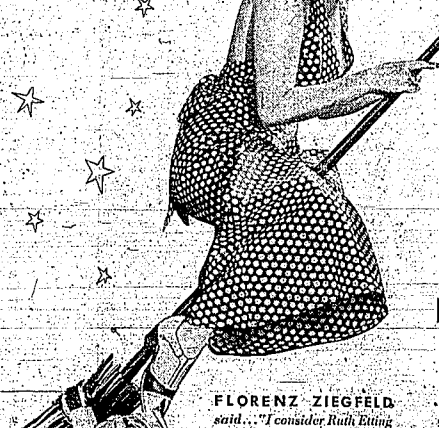
