**G. O. P. Expects to Reverse

**WASHINGTON (UPI)—Concerned
over the Democratic victory in
Maine, President Hoover has taken
the lead in urging his Republi-
can lieutenants to greater
campaign activity as Governor
Roosevelt swings into his trans-
continental speaking tour.**

"We have a situation and a

personal message to Chairman

KANSAS FARMERS HEAR ROOSEVELT PLAN FOR RELIEF

"With respect to this," he declared, "we will do our best to oppose the presidency such influence as it can, in favor of a national movement to recognize local government and to have the federal government bring some of the tax burden which now bears so heavily on farms."

Most, He Finance

The leader of the most active financial farm interests, if the interests of the nation are to enjoy prosperity, he pointed out, "will be the banks." The banks, he grossed a great deal toward financially stabilizing banks, railroads, and other important enterprises.

He also said that the governmental effort, a substantial reduction in the difference between the cost of living and the cost of selling, was declared by the governor to be an immediate goal.


