The third-place Senators lost to the Yankees, 7 to 1, in eight innings. Cleveland's Hank Greenberg hit a home run.

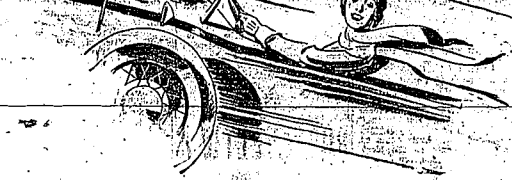
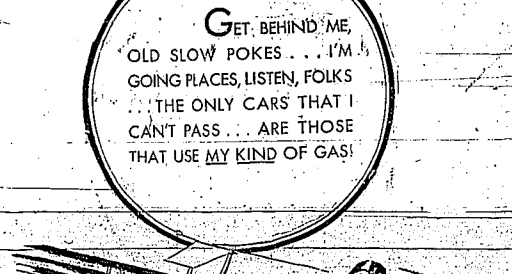

(Continued From Page One) This hour of our lives clinging to the sea, our pantons weakened, and the water too deep for an anchor...

Pounds On Rocks The amphibian was being pounded on the rocks but continuing to hold to the water as the plane sank...

We started making camp A man of the boat offered us the first shelter. We made a camp first at once, using a little oil lamp for a light.

We sent rocks floating into the water night, there was no response. We hurried together, but could not keep warm.

At dawn, when the sun was up, we reached one wing of the plane and took off the canvas cover. We used this to make a tent for our camp.

Children In Distress We decided to stay on the island. The women had colic, and the children were crying from hunger on the rocks. We used the live-rocker covers to make shoes for our children.

Another night set in. At about 10 P. M. we saw a light, which seemed to be a search light. The light was hidden by the fog.

We realized that if the ship passed we might never see it. We used our last food, making coffee and eating it with relish.

We went. The ship acknowledged our signals. We were rescued. Slowly the ship, the Lord Talbot, worked its way through the ice fields after three hours' waiting.

We were very happy to see the ship. At dawn the Lord Talbot came a lifeboat, and we got aboard. As we left the island, a huge iceberg crashed into the water.

Captain Watson and his crew, all Scotch, gave us a hearty welcome. We were dirty and tired, and went to sleep in the cabin's quarters.

As soon as we had tried to get back for receiving us. The weather was not so good, and we were ordered a new ship for the rescue.

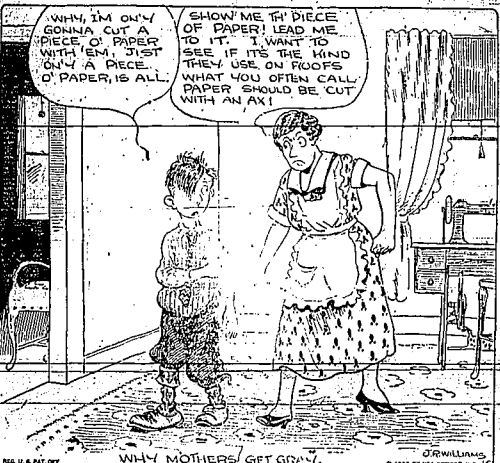

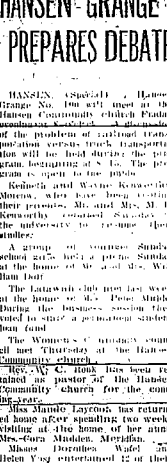
