Yanks' Outfield Far Superior to Chicago Cubs' Claims Kirksey

Scribe Sees Ruth As Only Uncertainty in New York Outing Garden Due to Late Illness; Combs Expert Leadoff Man

CHICAGO, (UP)—No for me, as for trio, field, on the bases or at the bat, the New York Yankees outfield is vastly superior to the Chicago Cubs' combination.

The Yankees have Babe Ruth, batter extraordinary and veteran of nine world series, Earl Combs, one of baseball's best ballhitters and leadoff man, and Benny Chapman, the major league's "flicker" player and leading base stealer. The Cubs have Biggs Stephenson, a courageous and hard-working player, Johnny Moore, neither a great batsman nor outfielder, and Fritzi Clayton, finishing his worst season in nine years in the majors.

The only uncertainty about the Yankees' outfield is the late Ruth's physical condition after a recent touch of appendicitis. If the Yankees in Chicago, he alone will carry enough power to wreck the Cubs' lineup.

In nine previous series, three with the Yankees and six with the Cubs, the Yankees' outfield has made 15 home runs and 13 errors, while the Cubs' outfield has made 11 home runs and 13 errors.

Clayton has played in two world series. He batted .216 in the series against the Athletics.

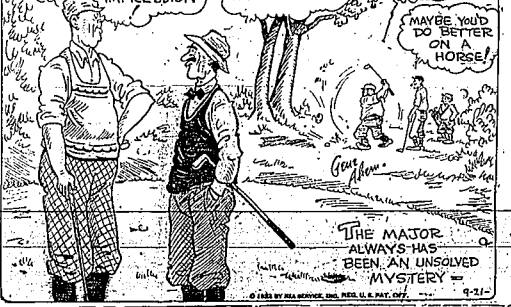
