Rocky Mountain conference football teams will be scattered over half the continent this weekend, with four inter-sectional games to be played.





MODERN PIONEERS ERECTING CABINS

Michigan Welfare Organization Sends Colony to State-Owned Land

JOHNSONVILLE, Mich. (UPI)—A small band of elderly pioneers, seeking a new frontier to support their families, have pitched tents in a wooded section near here in the state of Michigan, colony on state-owned land.

The pioneers, heads of families ranging in age from 60 to 85, came from the Detroit welfare department, in a truck, rented by the city of Dearborn.

They came to survey, claim and settle 100-acre plots of cut-over farmland, owned by the state of Michigan.

Led by Ernest Lanzon, a carpenter, the settlers set to work to build simple, one-room houses in the woods, with the help of Oseaga county. With axes and pick-axes, they felled timber for the houses.

The group, eight in number, brought supplies for six weeks.

Each family has a cabin, and each cabin, and an acre plot of land, before their supplies are exhausted.

With the cabin constructed, the settlers began a winter in the woods.

The settlers plan to live in the woods until the spring, and children and additional supplies.

The Detroit welfare department, which organized the venture, and (inexpensive) of their services, has promised to assist them through the first year. In every way possible.

By next year, the settlers believe, they won't need assistance.

After that, they will be able to live off the soil. And,

in five years, the land will belong to them.

IOWA CITY, Iowa (UPI)—Joseph R. Attinger, who was hanged here for the murder of a 12-year-old boy, was suffering from mental disease and should have been sent to an asylum instead of being put to death, Dr. Andrew H. Woods, contends today.

Dr. Woods, a psychiatrist at the Psychopathic Hospital at the University of Iowa, spent six months in a court room examination and reported his findings in a report filed with the County Medical association.

Dr. Woods, twin brother of Dr. Woods, began tests in his office to determine the condition of the slayer's mind.

Six months he worked before pronouncing him as insane and suffering from a disease of the brain that under state law exempted him from the death penalty and sent him to an asylum instead of the gallows.
