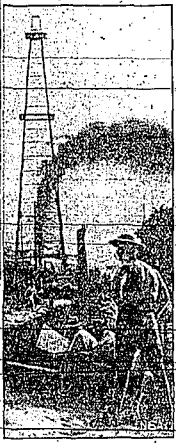
JOHANNESBURG, Mich. (UPI)—
A small band of modern pioneers
siding a new frontier to supply
their families have picked land
in a wooded colony now here to
start a homestead colony on state-
owned land.

The pioneers, heads of families
disenfranchised from the Northern
Mich. welfare department, arrived
last week, headed by the wife of
a doctor.

"They came to survey, claim and
make a record of a plot of eastern
hardwood land, now owned by the
state department of conservation."
Led by Ernest Langston, a well-
known carpenter, the settlers set
to work immediately to establish
a home in the woodland wilderness
of Clear Lake. With axes and
cross-cut saws, they fell timber
for the first log cabin.

The colony site is under
drainage and for six weeks
they hope to complete the
work and set out a plot of land
before their supplies are exhausted.
With the cabins constructed in
the winter, the pioneers plan
to return to Dearborn for their axes
and other additional supplies.
The Dearborn welfare depart-
ment, approving the contract
and feasibility of their action, has
promised to assist them through
the first year in every way possi-
ble.

By next year, the settlers be-
lieve they will need assistance,
but will be able to wrest their
own living from the soil. And
in five years, the land will be
long to them.

DOCTOR ASSERTS
SLAYER INSANE

J. R. Atringer Should Have
Been In Asylum
Contends Physician



IOWA CITY, Ia. (UPI)—Joseph
R. Atringer, who was hanged last
spring for the murder of a 12-
year-old girl, was sane when he
was hanged, Dr. Andrew H. Woods
reported today.

Dr. Woods, director of the
Psychopathic hospital at the Uni-
versity of Iowa, spent six months
last year examining Atringer and
reported his findings in a paper
filed with the County Medical as-
sociation.

Dr. Woods twice asked that
Atringer be kept in a hospital of
observation to conduct further ex-
aminations, but other psychiatrists
had expressed the opinion that
Atringer was sane and eligible to
go to the gallows.

Atringer, a young man, was ex-
ecuted at the state penitentiary at
Fort Madison last spring. He had
served the term of a 12-year
old. Duquenois, Ia. boy whose body
was found in the Mississippi river
basins.

After Atringer had been hanged,
Dr. Woods began work in his
laboratory to determine the con-
dition of the slayer's brain. For
six months he worked before an-
nouncing that his suspicions had
been confirmed. "Atringer was
suffering from a disease of the
brain that under state law exempted
him from the death penalty and
sentenced him to life in the
asylum."

"The next attack on this front is to reverse this (deflationary) process. That battle is in progress." We attacked "sectors" and "gangs" and "battled" again and again.

The commander in chief of the Army and Navy reiterated that a "great national victory has been achieved." He said "We won this battle to protect our people and homes. Let that man who complains that things could be worse thank God for this victory and make reverent acknowledgment of the courage and stamina of a great democracy."

But while the Chief was assuring his hearers that the upward march had taken place, the victory had been won and the country saved, one of his hearers, Ogden Mills, in equally militaristic fashion told the audience they were veritable "veterans fresh from the front lines, trenches of economic war" but that it was too early to claim victory. "A major task still lies before the country," he advised. "The depression proper is still to be overcome."

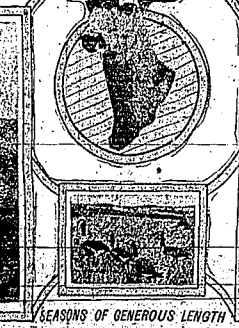
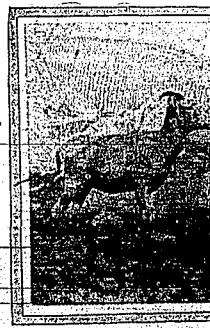
