Preparations Made to Care for Crowds Expected at Bull Thursday Night

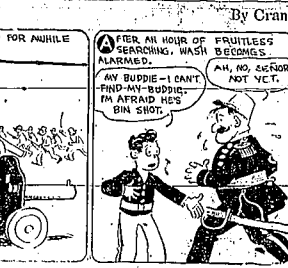
