SAN FRANCISCO (UPI)—Headed by the Stanford-Sanford California clash at Palo Alto, the Pacific coast game schedule for tomorrow promises several treats for the more than 200,000 spectators who will swarm into the stadium.

The Cardinal-Trojan contest brings together two of the three unbeaten and untied teams of the conference. The winner will have an excellent chance to play for the mythical conference title.

University of California at Los Angeles, the third team on an unbeaten record, meets Cal Tech, a major power which has won all its games.

Pittsburgh vs. Ohio State, a repeat of last year's game, is also set.
