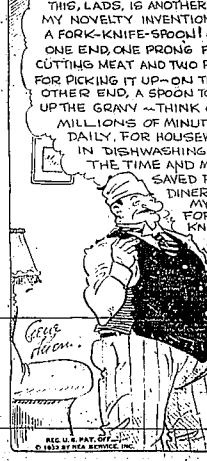

The familiar slogan, "Safety First" is particularly suited as an admonition for hunters, to be followed with care, constantly.

### TAKING A HAND IN THE GAME

It is encouraging to any student of government to notice that all over the country abnormally high registration figures are being rolled up in preparation for the coming elections.

Just what this vast outpouring of voters may mean to the various candidates is a matter for the political experts to worry about; to the lay observer, it means quite clearly that the American citizen is taking a deep interest in the affairs of government this fall and means to have his say about things. And no matter which way he votes, this is a healthy sign.

The one great foe of Democratic government is public apathy at election time. The voter who votes in ignorance or passion and helps the wrong man get into office is not nearly as much of a menace to good government as the voter who can't be bothered to vote at all. This year's elections, however they may go, are at least not going to be defeat.

How desperate the Republican leaders have become in their effort to reelect President Hoover is seen in the misleading propaganda now being issued by the high and low of that party. Consider a typical utterance of the Spokane Spokesman-Review:

A vote for Roosevelt and Garner on November 8 would be a vote for "a competitive tariff" to open the markets of the United States to fierce foreign competition in all the basic products of the Pacific northwest. A competitive tariff would injure the poultry industry, the dairy industry, the orchard industry, the general farming industry, the forest products industry, the others.

The Democratic party platform and the Democratic candidates have said nothing of the kind. What Governor Roosevelt has said is that:

The Roosevelt tariff has largely extinguished the export markets for our industrial products and our farm surplus; it has prevented the payment of public and private debts to us and the interest thereon, increasing taxation to meet the expense of our government, and finally it has driven our factories abroad.

There are two kinds of tariffs, the sane and insane and the Spokesman-Review has worshipped so long before the gods of protectionism that it can recognize none but the latter. The Democrats do not ask for free trade; they do ask a reasonable tariff that will not shackle every port in the nation, and that will benefit the farmer as well as the favored industrialist. Had such a policy been followed this country would not now be prostrate in the ruins of commerce and industry.

Obviously the Republican party is sorely worried over the present trend toward Roosevelt and the probability of a congress Democratic in both houses. The next three weeks will be the climax of the campaign and the party in power will use every possible agency and means in the attempt to turn the growing tide and avert a Democratic landslide.

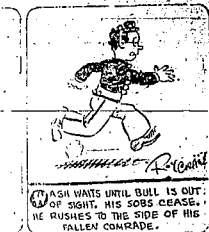
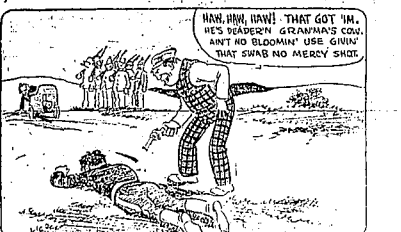

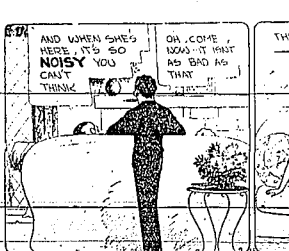
