AUTO LICENSE FEE TAKES LOWER RATE

Quarterly Charge Goes Into Effect First of Month

An innovation in automobile license "privileges" will be put into effect at the office of the county auditor in October. No longer will there be automatic renewal of an auto license. Instead, an application for a plan to issue license plates on a quarterly basis.

At this present time applicants must apply annually. This practice, half-yearly, causes this practice having dated from Aug. 1.

Fees charged will slightly exceed the amount of money on last year's rates, nevertheless considerably lower than the annual license fee. The quarterly rate will be 1/4 the annual license charge, plus the equivalent of personal property tax, and it is stated will represent a reduction in price from the half-yearly rates.

73 Absentee Voters Request
Tickets from County
Auditor

Fourteen persons have already registered in Twin Falls county, it was reported at the office of the county auditor. Thirty-one applications to date to receive ballots have already been submitted.

This is the largest number ever received for absent ballot applications since the election of 1948, according to the auditor.

Plans of the applications came from Washington, D. C., for exact information, he said.




